What Are You Willing To Change?

My dear parishioners, Jesus of Nazareth was not employed during the active years of his pastoral ministry. Nevertheless, he applied himself energetically to his mission, ranging far and wide to teach and bring peace to troubled lives. He devoted every moment of his spare time to praying in deserts and synagogues. He implored God to feed, heal, and protect his followers. He forgave sins and wept over faithless Jerusalem.



The people Jesus came to serve were disheartened. Hounded by anxiety, they did not know whom or what to trust. Orphans, widows and the poor live in fear of exploitation. Greed and violence were tolerated on all sides. The call to personal holiness was a distant memory. Everyone, it seemed, was ensnared by futility and dread of the future.

Nevertheless, Jesus knew the widespread corruption he witnessed was not unique to Judea or Roman Palestine. Human brokenness is universal and at its root is rebellion against God. The people of Israel needed to change. Indeed, the whole world required a divine regeneration. So Jesus undertook the hard work of change, that "having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which (God) has called you." [Eph 1:18]

Crucially, Jesus wanted everyone to know God intimately as he did. His own relationship with God was as an obedient son to his loving heavenly father. He took every opportunity to pray, often disappearing to quiet places unknown to his apostles. He prayed at home, in the synagogue, on the roadside, in the desert. No place or occasion was off-limits to communing with God. Prayer before his provident father came before all else. As Luke's gospel records, Jesus always prayed before acting in miraculous ways. He said, "whatever you ask in prayer, you will receive, if you have faith." [Mt 21:22]

COVID-19 VIRUS UPATE

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Here is a message from Daniel Cardinal DiNardo to the Archdiocese, March 17, 2020, concerning the COVID-19 (coronavirus):

- **"MASS:** The public celebration of all weekday and Sunday Masses will be suspended in the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston effective Wednesday, March 18, 2020. Churches are to remain open for individual and private prayer observing their normal hours, as discerned by the Pastors.
- **"HOLY WEEK:** Particular directives will be given for Holy Week in the event the crisis continues through that time period.
- **"FUNERALS:** Funerals may take place only in the form of 'The Rite of Committal with Final Commendation' (also known as the 'graveside'). A memorial Mass can be scheduled appropriately at a later date."
- We will update our website, www.stphiliphuffmantx.org, and **Facebook** page as necessary and will also communicate through the **MyParish** app. Please also visit www.archgh.org/resources/health-updates/mass-and-liturgy-livestream-schedule for the most recent updates from the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston.

As we all use good judgement to limit our contact with other people in a public place, I hope you will take the opportunity to find peace and quiet with our Lord in prayer. *Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.* [Philippians 4:6-7]

Confirmation Retreat


March 22nd parent meeting and March 28th & 29th Confirmation retreat are **CANCELED**.

Triduum Q & A

Question:

I am not as familiar with the Triduum Services as I would like. What happens that's different from a normal Sunday Mass?



Answer:

Holy Week liturgies are unique and rich in symbolism. The Mass for **Palm Sunday** follows the pattern of the day

2,000 years ago when Jesus entered Jerusalem. It includes a Gospel reading outside the church building and the entrance of the priest into the sanctuary while the congregation waves palms.

The **Holy Thursday Mass** also follows the rhythm of the ancient Last Supper. The presider washes the feet of members of the congregation, like Jesus washed the feet of the disciples. After Mass, all remaining hosts are taken to an altar of repose, where adoration of the Blessed Sacrament often occurs late into the night. Parishioners can remain like the disciples in Gethsemane, asked to "watch and pray."

On **Good Friday**, we celebrate another special liturgical service. Following the Liturgy of the Word, there is a communal reverencing of the cross. The intercessions are solemn and include prayers for many different groups of people, reminding us that Jesus' passion is for the whole world. There is no Liturgy of the Eucharist. Hosts consecrated on Holy Thursday are distributed, after which the tabernacle is empty. The tabernacle remains empty through **Holy Saturday** — just as Jesus departed from this earthly world in death — and we wait in hope for **Easter Sunday!**

CCE Transitioning to Online Classes



Due to concerns about meeting in large groups and to provide our families a solid plan moving forward, CCE will be transitioning to on-line classes for the remainder of the semester. **Catechists will**

email lesson material to their classes each week for the students to complete with their parents at home.


- For **K-5**, this email may include using Loyola Press' on-line resources that families can log on and complete. Your child's teacher will tell you which unit and lesson to do each week. These lessons also include interactive assessments and reviews that students can complete and then email results back to the teacher. All needed information will also be provided in the email.
- **6th/7th Grade** does not have online lessons, so everything to complete a particular week's lesson will be included in the weekly email. Loyola Press does provide an 'Interactive Session Review' on-line that may be used.

2020 CENSUS



This year the United States census will be conducted and our archdiocese is encouraging us to participate because it is important to our communities and nation. We are told that it is **Easy, Safe, and Important**. It is a fact that from one-third to one-half of our population has moved since the last census ten years ago. This changes the needs of every community due to the needs of the people in that community.

The **Census is Easy** because it only consists of 9 questions. There is no question regarding immigration or citizenship. The **Census is Safe** because no other governmental agency will be able to access the information collected. *It is against the LAW.* The **Census is Important** because the distribution of 675 billion dollars will be impacted by the results of this year's census. Improvement of our roads, buildings, bridges, etc. will all be improved or neglected due to the results of this census. Even our electoral votes are affected by the census!

By March 12th everyone will receive a letter encouraging us to participate. We may respond online or call in our information. On April 20th the census form will be mailed to everyone, even if you have already responded. If you are interested in being a census taker go to the following site.

- To access the on-line resources: FindingGod.com; click on the Orange box (ignore the blue box); then click on 'Parent Resources'. From there, click on your child's grade level and you will see a list of all units and lessons.
- Your child will use the textbook pages provided and parents will use the online resource to help them understand the lesson and share content information. The child will take the 'Interactive Session Review'.
- **8th/9th grade and Confirmation** textbooks do not have online resources. All materials will be emailed each week with instructions.

If any family does not have the technology at home to make this work, we can arrange to get you a textbook and the corresponding instruction pages from the teacher's manual. Call Becky Pursell @ (713) 516-7376 to make arrangements to get the material.

Be assured that the entire CCE team is here to assist you with these lessons. Do not hesitate to call, text, email or send a carrier pigeon if that's what it takes. We are happy to hear from you and lend assistance.

No less important was Jesus' desire to strike human brokenness at its root. To accomplish this necessitated he bear the immense weight of human infidelity on his divine shoulders. Death's power would be destroyed by the sacrificial offering of his own life. Therefore, he "emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men, (humbling) himself and (becoming) obedient unto death, even death on a cross." [cf. Phi 2:6-11]


Personal Holy Week Challenge

Whenever the Church's sacraments are celebrated, the echo of Jesus' voice is heard. *What are you willing to change?* Are you willing to search for quiet places to encounter God? Are you willing to become holy as God is holy? Are you willing to grasp God's guiding hand in all activities of your life? Are you willing to change people's understanding of God by your own example? Soon enough you will realize the path to Jesus is found in the act of leading others to him. Do not worry. You will be given strength and courage to make the daily sacrifices God requires of you.

In each person's life the hour will come when he cries out for a person worthy to receive his ultimate trust. It is Jesus of Nazareth, risen from the dead, who answers your every need, your every longing, your every desire for genuine love. "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." [Mt 11:28-30]

Jesus once came to us, and he will come again. Risen from the dead, he has ascended to the heavens to take his place at the right hand of his heavenly father. At the appointed time, he will return in glory to gather his elect. But we are not without wisdom, nor cast away for lack of a home. We have his teachings. We live in his Church. His apostles are in our midst to this very day. Take this thought to heart. God sent his Holy Spirit to dwell among us as our *Counselor*, to open for us the storehouse of Our Lord's teachings and *bring to our remembrance all that he has said to us*. 


TWELFTH STATION

Sacraments

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

If you have been participating actively *at least six months* after registration in the parish, you may ask for an appointment with the pastor to begin marriage preparation. Marriage preparation requires six months.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Children age 6 or younger, the following documents **are required** before baptism date may be scheduled: parish registration, birth certificate, and baptism class certifications. Godmother and Godfather must be in good standing as practicing Catholics.

If you have been participating actively at least six months after registration in the parish, you may call the parish office to begin baptismal preparation.

FUNERAL SERVICES

To ensure that parish ministers can assist you, please call the parish office **before** setting dates and times for funeral services. Regarding personal spoken remembrances at funeral liturgies, St. Philip parish adheres to the policies of the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston.
