Grumbling? Humbling!

My fellow parishioners, in these days of uncertainty and turmoil, I find myself struggling more with grumbling and complaining. Why can't others see my (obvious) point of view? I know I am right! Are schools open or not? Did that guy at the produce aisle just cough? This mask fogs my glasses. People! Really? OK. Enough grumbling! If you are anything like me it becomes easy to spend time grumbling about



anything and everything as I go throughout my day. I know that my grumbling is never in the interest of others, but that I am being self-absorbed and selfish. I know I am being more concerned about myself. My grumbling and complaining is certainly a symptom of a prideful mindset and puts me before others. I also know that humility is the opposite of pride. How can I turn from pride/grumbling towards humility?

"Do" without grumbling

Thankfully, we are guided by Scripture. "Do all things without grumbling or questioning, that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world." [Phil 2: 14-15] So, we must stop grumbling and do as Jesus instructs: "The good man out of the good treasure of his heart produces good, and the evil man out of his evil treasure produces evil; for out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks." [Lk 6: 45] Ouch! It looks like we have work to do. In all our daily "to-do's," God commands us to do them without grumbling and to be humble of heart.

The verse in Philippians says "do" everything without grumbling or arguing. In all we "do," we are "To-Do" it without grumbling. Our life phases are full of To-Do Lists. We have all had bosses, customers, clients, church/school/events, and family To-Do Lists that conflict with our self-interested view of setting our priorities. When I spend time grumbling throughout my day, I am basically saying

Thanking God for graces and blessings received, acknowledging the intercession of a blessed or saint or seeking spiritual assistance for one's own special need are very good reasons to pray. As well, we pray for the deceased to honor and remember them and for the holy souls to be released from purgatory to enjoy eternity with God and the saints in heaven. In all these ways the mystical Body of Christ remains in intimate communion with Christ himself. The greatest and most powerful prayer we possess is the Mass. The fruits of the Mass are the very fruits of Jesus' redemption. This is why our Church encourages the faithful to have Mass offered for loved ones, both living and deceased. It is a worthy and ancient Catholic devotional practice.

To have a Mass offered, please call our St. Philip parish office at (281) 324-1478. We will let you know what Masses are available in the liturgical calendar. Mass intentions may be requested for most weekdays and Sundays but not every solemnity or holy day of obligation, for example, the Nativity of the Lord (Christmas), Holy Week or All Souls.

Requests will be honored in the order in which they are received at our parish office. A \$5.00 stipend, as determined by diocesan policy, is usual for each Mass your priest will offer on your behalf. Mass requests will be granted as close to the requested date and time as possible. If it is not possible to comply with the primary request, the next closest date and time will be scheduled. Stop by the office or give us a call. We will help you!




Wednesday evenings will enable all parents of Middle and High School age children to attend our study while their children are receiving CCE instruction. We all hope that many parents will join us.


Grumbling about others

Sometimes our grumbling is not about what we are doing or what we need to do. Sometimes our grumbling is about others. In James 5:9 it says, "Do not grumble, brethren, against one another, that you may not be judged; behold, the Judge is standing at the doors." Instead, we are called to "encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing." [1Thes 5:11]

A recent livestream Mass homily challenged viewers: "How have I served someone else today; what can I do to help someone tomorrow?" Time spent grumbling is certainly not time spent in prayer, humility, or charity. We are reminded that our hearts and minds will be filled. The question is with what?

A personal challenge

For many of us it was weeks since receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation and months since receiving the Eucharist. Since March, we collectively hit the "Pause Button" in many ways. Now is the time of reflection and a call to action for inner change. I'm ready to pledge days of reflection calling for a "grumble-out." 

Women/Young Women/Girls:

Sacraments

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

If you have been participating actively at least six months after registration in the parish, you may ask for an appointment with the pastor to begin marriage preparation. Marriage preparation requires six months.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Children age 6 or younger, the following documents are required before baptism date may be scheduled: parish registration, birth certificate, and baptism class certifications. Godmother and Godfather must be in good standing as practicing Catholics.

If you have been participating actively at least six months after registration in the parish, you may call the parish office to begin baptismal preparation.

FUNERAL SERVICES

To ensure that parish ministers can assist you, please call the parish office *before* setting dates and times for funeral services. Regarding personal spoken remembrances at funeral liturgies, St. Philip parish adheres to the policies of the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston.
