Accomplish His Work

My fellow parishioners, I enjoy recalibrating my Catholic faith through "lessons learned." I owe a great personal debt to Diocese of Lansing, MI Bishop Kenneth Povish (1924-2003) for his counsel and friendship. This reflection shares my notes when the Bishop led a 1990 (yes, 30+ years ago) Pastoral Council Weekend Retreat. I relished the privilege of working with



Bishop Povish on projects including Time to Renew, and Be Attitudes! I recall an example of his quick wit and down-to-earth evangelization. In our Flint, MI parish, my wife had prepared a vegetarian lunch for a Pastoral Council meeting. Upon seeing the buffet, he smiled and said: "I see there's no meat, so we won't need a blessing before our meal!" He always made everyone feel welcome and at ease; yet he was steadfast in his role as mentor and pastoral leader. His lifelong commitment theme. . to accomplish His work included his vision for the Church to foster educated and active parishioners. "Jesus said to them, 'My food is to do the will of him who sent me, and to accomplish his work." [Jn4:34]

Back to the retreat, way back in 1990. Reviewing old notes is like opening our family photo album from 30 years ago. I enjoy seeing how our family has grown, yet in many ways, smiles and togetherness have not changed one bit. Similarly, reviewing what it meant to be a Catholic in 1990 and even comparing to what it meant to be a Catholic in 1960 mirrored today's similarities and differences from 2020 and 1990. Wow. I could be sitting in that same auditorium today hearing that our Catholic rights and privileges require responsibilities and obligations, including saying YES to serve our parishes. It energizes me to see that 1960 priorities were THE SAME as 1990, and THE SAME as 2020: 1) bring back the joy of being Catholic; 2) challenge our parishioners to do something beyond 'the minimum.'

Bringing back the joy of being Catholic is a lifelong quest for all of us. I still enjoy reflecting on these retreat exercises today:

Parade Around the Our Father — VBS



At our St. Philip annual Vacation Bible School last week, 31 campers, 19 youth, and 13 adults had a great event. While learning what each part of the *Our Father* prayer means, we also talked about The Eucharist, the bread of Life. God listens, God provides, God forgives, God guides, and Priests serve God were our themes for each day.

Our days at camp started with an opening skit and introductory lesson on the day's main lesson. Then, in 5 program areas; Bible, Crafts, Music, Games and

Snacks, that lesson was reinforced. In Bible class, the kids heard the story of St. Joseph of Cupertino, the flying friar and learned bible verses that reinforced

each day's theme. In crafts, the kids made a giant scroll with personal notes thanking Father Barker for serving God at our parish and bringing us the sacraments. They presented it to Father on our last day.

Each year, the kids participate in a service project to benefit a chosen charity. This year, to reinforce what the *Our Father* teaches us as we pray "Give us this day our daily bread", we chose Martha's Kitchen. The children raised over \$400 to help the soup kitchen provide lunches for Houston's homeless and hungry.

What are some specific service opportunities in joining the Women's Guild?

The Women's Guild assists other parish ministries by providing receptions and decorating the parish hall. Upon request, we host funeral receptions in the parish hall or deliver food dishes to the homes of the family's deceased. We also support charities outside of St. Philip.

The group is about parish women enjoying life in Christ together. Our members celebrate the warmth, talents, experiences and feelings of one another as we work and pray together. We are open to having others in our lives, and we hope our new members will include *you!* Basically, this team of service-minded women band together whenever and wherever they are needed.

What is required for membership?

Membership dues for 2021-22 are \$20.00 which you pay with cash or check. Make checks payable to St. Philip Catholic Church Women's Guild. You can also choose to be an active member or an inactive member.

Mary's Blessings Ministry at St. Philip is a social service which provides financial assistance to those who call and ask for our help. Our Lord instructed his body, the church: "Do not reject an afflicted suppliant, nor turn your face away from the poor." [Sir 4:4] This is why, with your help, we continue year after year providing for the poor in our area.

We inform area churches that we are available to those they may recommend to us. We also reach out through our local Food Pantry at the First Baptist Church in Huffman. Flyers in area stores let those in need know how to contact us.

Currently we have twelve members and teams of two persons each who respond to calls made to our dedicated phone. We normally meet once a month on the third Tuesday of the month in a classroom at St. Philip. The membership addresses any issues we need to solve. They assist in our bi-annual food drives, annual membership drive and in any other way that we are able to help those who call us. Our Compassion Committee is available to offer ongoing compassionate calls to those who are suffering in ways we cannot assist financially.



Saints of the Week Series

St. Mary Magdalene, Feast Day July 22

St. Mary Magdalene is one of the greatest saints of the Bible and a legendary example of God's mercy and grace. She was present with Christ during his public ministry, death and resurrection. As a sinner whom Jesus saved, she is an example of how no person is beyond the saving grace of God.

Mary likely watched the crucifixion from a distance along with the other women who followed Christ during His ministry. Mary was present when Christ rose from the dead. She had visited his tomb to anoint his body only to find the stone rolled away and Christ, very much alive, sitting at the place they laid Him. She was the first witness to His resurrection.

St. Mary Magdalene is the patroness of converts, repentant sinners, sexual temptation, pharmacists, tanners and women, and many other places and causes.

Our retreat declared 1990 as "The Year of the 'Sunday." Presentations and break-out sessions featured probing questions. I still have my "ouch" moments today when reviewing them:

- + How can I extend my Sundays past one hour?
- t What were my best Sundays? Why? What were my worst Sundays? Why?
- + How <u>do</u> I observe Sundays? How <u>should</u> I observe Sundays?
- + What will I do more of on Sundays? What will I do less of on Sundays?
- + How about having a 'Sunday' Tuesday, or a 'Sunday' Thursday?
- + Am I satisfied with my life as a Catholic . . on Sunday. . on Tuesday?

I find "fill-in-the-blank" exercises and breakout group sharing challenging. Here is a good one from our


retreat: "Responsible, growing Catholics are people who _____." As years go by, if I am honest with myself, I judge whether I am *really* growing through faith-in-action.

My morning prayers continue to center on a retreat acronym to become a **W.I.S.E.** Catholic based on four pillars. Always **W**ORSHIP and pray constantly (liturgy and evangelization). Practice INSTRUCTION (through education, bible reading, and catechesis). Offer **S**ERVICE (stewardship, charity, joining ministries). Finally, these pillars are **E**VERYONE'S responsibility (through our Baptism and "confirmed" in our Confirmation).

Whether in 1960,1990, and yes, 2020, many Catholics in their pews wait for their "professionals" to *do* the evangelization. Yes, *somebody* needs to *do something* about declining Mass attendance, fewer marriages in the church, fewer Baptisms and Confirmations, and alarming declines in spiritual vocations. Joining our ministries is a great start to

becoming educated and active parishioners as examples for others to follow.

On the bright side, we can strive to be **WISE** Catholics with our collective responsibility "to accomplish His work." Sincerely in Christ, Tim Logsdon
