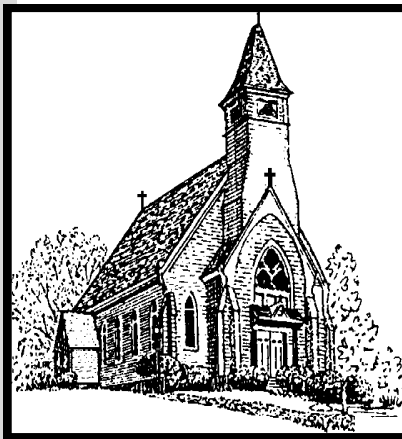

St. Anne Parish Discount Card Fundraiser

This summer we have a number of improvement projects happening at the parish. Some of these have already begun, and some will happen soon. We need new oil tanks in the church, the wood work on the exterior of the parish hall needs to be repaired and repainted, we have added curtains to the hall, the floor in the choir loft needs to be repaired, and more. To help offset these costs, we are starting a *St. Anne Parish Discount Card Fundraiser*. These cards feature discounts at some of our local establishments and are good for multiple visits all year long.

As a fundraiser, this program has not cost the parish anything, and has the potential to raise \$5,000 or more. The proceeds from this program will be used to help offset the costs of these capital improvements and also to help support Religious Education and youth activities. Our goal is to sell 300 of these discount cards.

We are hoping to sell the cards through multiple avenues, including having them available at the Parish Office. More information will be forthcoming as to when and where the cards will be sold. If you want to participate in this fundraiser please contact the parish office.

CATECHISTS NEEDED AT ALL GRADE LEVELS FOR THE FALL: WHY PEOPLE MIGHT HESITATE TO BECOME A CATECHIST

(Adapted from A Catechist Journey)

Maybe being a catechist is something you feel God is calling you to, but you've got some reservations. Joe Paprocki, a former Director of Religious Education and current 8th grade catechist came up with some reasons why he thinks that people hesitate to volunteer to be a catechist which he published on his website, *Catechist's Journey* www.catechistsjourney.org. These are reprinted here with Joe's permission. We've given our own reassurances after each hesitation plus some experiences and insights from other long-time catechists replying to Joe's questions. "I'm hesitant to become a catechist because..."

"...I don't know if I can handle a group of kids. I don't know if kids will like me."

Everyone is nervous going into a classroom on their first day of teaching (Some of us were nervous for our first several weeks of teaching). The good news is that the children already know how to behave in a classroom from being at school. They know what acceptable behavior is and what it is not. The bad news is that they will sometimes act up. Children thrive when there are clear expectations for their behavior and clear consequences for when they step out of line. If you are friendly, fair, well-prepared, fun and firm with your students, classroom discipline comes easier. And people of all ages like others who are friendly, fair, well-prepared, fun and firm.

"...I don't know if I'll be able to answer kids' questions."

Our textbooks are very easy to use and the answers to most questions you will be asked will come from the text. However, sometimes, kids come up with really excellent questions that are not all that easy to answer. There is absolutely nothing wrong with saying, "I don't know, but I'll find out and tell you next time we meet." Then, after class, you can just find Karla or myself and ask us for the answer or we'll look it up and get back to you.

"...I'm not sure that I have anything to share. I'm not that holy; I'm just a regular person."

Teaching religion is not just about passing on facts for memorization. In addition to helping the children learn about God, the catechist must help the young people in his or her class to get to know Jesus Christ through His Church; to foster in them a relationship with Jesus. If you're thinking about serving God as a catechist, you probably have a relationship with Our Lord already. And your good relationship with God probably happened as part of a process, not all of a sudden. You can share some of how you got to where you are with God now. And the struggle it sometimes is to stay that way. And as far as not being holy enough goes, let's look at the example of the canonized saints. They considered themselves regular people, too. They love God with all their mind, with all their heart, and with all their strength. Does that sound like someone else you know?

"...I'm not sure that I know just what the Church teaches. I'm afraid I'll say something wrong."

Our textbooks are in conformity with the Catechism of the Catholic Church. That means that everything in our textbooks is in line with what the Church teaches. The key here is never to guess at what the Church teaches. If you don't know, just say, "I'm not sure, let me get back to you" and ask either Karla or myself or consult the Catechism available to you in the classroom.

"...I don't have any formal training to teach and I've never taught before."

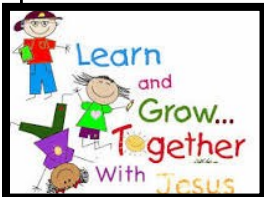
Have you ever shown someone else how to make one of your favorite recipes or use a computer program? Have you ever given someone else directions to a destination? If you can answer yes to questions like those, then guess what: you taught someone! Sure, not formally, but you taught them all the same. Our texts come with a variety of activities you can use in each lesson and they give you a hand with how to plan lessons. One of my professors at Boston College taught me a great saying, "God doesn't call the qualified; He qualifies the called." At St. Anne, we will train those who are called to the ministry of catechesis by teaching lesson planning, classroom management, etc., we have lists of local workshops available in the fall on how to teach a religion education class. We will be offering classes right here at St.

Anne too and there are many links to educational websites we can provide to you. You're not out there on your own;

Karla and I are here to help you in any way we can.

"...I don't know if I have the time."

Being a catechist is definitely a time commitment. And it's not just the hour or hour and half you're here in the classroom depending on the grade level you choose. Being as honest as we can with you, for your time with your students to go well, you need to prepare before you walk into the classroom for at least an hour but you could be preparing up to three hours a class. You will always want to prepare more than you think you can cover for class. The extra material prepared for this class can be used in the next class as a review so none of your time is wasted.
