

Luke 16:1-13 ~ Reflections on the Gospel


"And the master commended that dishonest steward for acting prudently." It's important to pay attention to the details of the parable Jesus tells in today's Gospel. At first glance, it might seem as if Jesus is encouraging us to be dishonest. But in fact, it's just the opposite. The steward in this tale was reported to his master "for squandering his property." In other words, the steward was not being responsible with what he was in charge of. And the master was ready to fire him on account of it. But then, the steward had a change of heart. (This isn't so hard to comprehend--sometimes it takes a real threat for us to realize we need to change our ways, doesn't it?) So the steward went to the people from whom he had previously collected money to "make friends" with them. How? By reducing their debts.

This might seem to be dishonest yet again, but we need to bear in mind that in the end, the master was pleased with the steward's behavior. So this debt reduction must not have affected the master's pocketbook. Rather, it seems probable that the steward had originally hiked up what the debtors owed the master and put the extra cash in his own pocket. This was the sort of extortion that was common in those days, among tax collectors for example. Now, when the steward was about to lose his position, he thought it wise to go back and return that "dishonest wealth" to the folks who had lost it, and gain some sympathy in the process. So, in the end, the

steward was making up for his previous cheating behavior by doing something RIGHT and smart. It's this honest behavior that will enable him to take his place in "eternal dwellings." And surely our honest behavior will have the same effect.

First Reconciliation/First Communion Sacrament Program
Baptized children receiving First Reconciliation and First
Communion this year will use RCL Benzinger's <u>We Celebrate the</u>
Eucharist text.

Children in the Second Year of Sacrament Preparation meet two Sundays a month from 9~10:30AM and will attend the 10:30AM Mass with an adult family member.

Grades 1 – 6 Religious Education Program

Children in Grades 1 - 6 follow Sadlier's We Believe, Project Disciple text.

Grade 1-2 (first year of sacrament preparation) Sunday 9-10:30AM or Monday 4-5:30PM [meets once a month] Grade 3 Sunday 9-10:30 or Monday 4-5:30PM [meets once a month]

Grade 4-5 Sunday 4-5:30PM or Monday 4-5:30PM [meets once a month]

Grade 6 Monday 7-8:30PM or Tuesday 4-5:30PM [meets once a month]

Grades 7 – 8 Religious Education Program

Youth in Grades 7 – 8 use Sadlier's <u>We Live Our Faith</u> text. We will also incorporate parts of Ascension Press' <u>Theology of the Body for Middle School</u> (a text based on St. John Paul II's reflections on the beauty and dignity of the human body) later in the year. We will introduce this text to parents at a meeting - date to be announced.

Grades 7-8 meet Monday 7-8:30PM or Tuesday 4-5:30PM once a month

Grades 9-10 Religious Education Program

Teens in Grades 9 and 10 use the diocesan suggested Ave Maria Press' <u>Catholic Essentials</u>. The High School program requires the completion of two years of Confirmation Preparation. Students in the first year of Confirmation Preparation attend classes once a month on Sunday evening from 7-8:30PM.

Confirmation Program

For teens in the second year of Confirmation Preparation. These students meet twice a month, once on Sunday evening from 7-8:30PM and additionally on a different Sunday morning from 9:00-10:30AM. The morning classes include breakfast at the beginning of the session, students end class by attending the 10:30AM Mass together.


