FROM A SERMON ON THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD BY ANASTASIUS OF SINAI, BISHOP

"Let us listen, then, to the sacred voice of God so compellingly calling us from on high, from the summit of the mountain, so that with the Lord's chosen disciples we may penetrate the deep meaning of these holy mysteries, so far beyond our capacity to express.

Let us run with confidence and joy to enter into the cloud like Moses and Elijah, or like James and John. Let us be caught up like Peter to behold the divine vision and to be transfigured by that glorious transfiguration. Let us retire from the world, stand aloof from the earth, rise above the body, detach ourselves from creatures and turn to the creator, to whom Peter in ecstasy exclaimed: Lord, it is good for us to be here.

It is indeed good to be here, as you have said, Peter. It is good to be with Jesus and to remain here for ever. What greater happiness or higher honor could we have than to be with God, to be made like him and to live in his light?

Therefore, since each of us possesses God in his heart and is being transformed into his divine image, we also should cry out with joy: It is good for us to be here — here where all things shine with divine radiance, where there is joy and gladness and exultation; where there is nothing in our hearts but peace, serenity and stillness; where God is seen. For here, in our hearts, Christ takes up his abode together with the Father, saying as he enters: Today salvation has come to this house. With Christ, our hearts receive all the wealth of his eternal blessings, and there where they are stored up for us in him, we see reflected as in a mirror both the first fruits and the whole of the world to come." SAINT ANNE BUILDING COMMITTEE AUGUST UPDATE

Here's the latest Parish Building Committee FAQ sheet:

When will construction on the church begin?

Our current plan anticipates construction on the church to begin in late Spring of 2024.

How will the construction interrupt mass?

Mass schedules will not be interrupted/altered.

How will the church host sacraments and other ceremonies while the church is under construction?

The Building Committee is working with Father Albert in determining schedules for sacraments. Disturbances to the interior of the church will be minimal.

How can I offer gifts in kind to the Capitol Campaign?

You can connect with a member of the Building Committee or Father Albert, who will be able to provide you with further information as to how you can donate.

Where can I donate to the Capitol Campaign?

How will parking be impacted during construction?

The Building Committee is extremely focused on this issue and will communicate any impacts well in advance. However, total parking spaces will increase as a result of this project.

Will I have the same access to the church buildings during construction? As previously mentioned, disturbances to the interior of the church will be minimal.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

Although Soviet communism ended in the early 1990s, its destructive effects linger in the societies where it once ruled. Under the communist system, cultural values of charity and volunteerism disappeared. Rapid, sometimes harsh transitions to market economies led to ongoing attitudes of materialism that have left poor and dependent people—such as children, seniors, and people with disabilities—particularly vulnerable. This is especially true in the former Soviet republic of Moldova, which, despite its political independence, is one of the poorest countries in Europe.

The Diocese of Chişinău, founded in 2000, covers all of Moldova and the unrecognized breakaway state of "Transnistria," currently occupied by Russian forces. Today the diocese contains 20 parishes and seven charity foundations that work to meet the spiritual and material needs of the people. This spirit of love for the most poor and needy is evident in Moldova's generous response not only to the needs of its own people but also to refugees fleeing the war in Ukraine.

Working in cooperation with Caritas Moldova, the diocese has expanded its outreach and ability to reveal Christ's mercy to Moldova's vulnerable children and youth by establishing a network of care and support centers, where children and youth benefit from informal education programs in a safe, caring environment. The centers also help strengthen the parenting skills of mothers and fathers. With funding from the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe, the diocese and its local partners have established the centers according to standards for quality and child protection to make them safe and caring environments.

Your support of the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe on the weekend of August 13 is crucial to the success of ministries that affirm the dignity of children, youth, and other vulnerable people and show them the love and mercy of Jesus.
