It determines if we find peace in this life and in the next. His peace is a gift. We do not earn it. We can only accept it. I pray that, whatever our situation and circumstance this Christmas, we may all be deeply moved by the wonderous love of God who so loved the world that He sent His Son as our Savior. May we turn anew to Jesus Christ, find a welcome place in His Church, and with it the joy, peace and hope God intends for us all.
