A Few Basic Concepts

- Adolescents are busier now than ever
- Sunday School is optional
- Have fun
- Sunday School attendance drops dramatically in High School for all faiths
- Lectures do not work
- Tying lesson to current events helps. It's amazing what you will find in the newspaper
- Allow students to choose a few lessons
- A shorter more meaningful lesson is better than a longer drawn out lesson
- Bring food
- Adolescents are looking for meaning
- The strongest influence on an adolescent is a strong Church youth group
- Peer pressure is both an asset and a liability
- The adolescent brain is wired differently than yours or mine (The New York Academy of Sciences had an excellent symposium a few years ago. You only need to read the introduction)
- § Shorter attention spans
- § Need greater stimulation to keep attention

Sample Curriculum

- 1. First Chapter of Genesis. Discuss mankind's creation and the importance of being created in his image and likeness.
- 2. Church calendar, church year, major feast days and that history is circular rather than linear (Revolving around Christs death and resurrection). Two weeks.
- 3. Interchangeable modules each lasting 6 to 8 weeks
- a. The Sacraments
- b. The Bible
- c. The Creed
- d. The Divine Liturgy

- e. Teenage 10 Commandments
- 4. Advent and Christmas (four weeks).
- a. Review Old Testament prophesies and play Handel's Messiah
- b. Read the Conception and Nativity stories in the New Testament and discuss
- c. Discuss the Wise men and their significance
- Read portions of Dickens Christmas Carol relations to Malory and the chains that bind him. Use chains as prop.
- Christmas break
- 6. Discuss Theophany and John the Baptist (one week)
- 7. Review each Oratorical topic and discuss (6-8 weeks). All students to work on topic in class. Host a writing party the week before your Parish event with food and all the resources. Have mentors there and help students with their topics
- 8. Discuss Prelent, Lent, daily Bible readings with an emphasis on daily Old Testament readings and Proverbs, Paraklesis and the Panayia, Holy Week, Pascha (4 weeks).
