- 4. The Great Entrance is when the Priest comes out with the Gifts of bread and wine.
- 5. We recite the Symbol of Faith (the Creed).
- 6. The Priest asks the Holy Spirit to bless us and the bread and wine, and they become the Body and Blood of Jesus.
- 7. We recite the Lord's Prayer.
- 8. We receive Holy Communion and our hearts are filled with God's love.
- 9. The priest gives us the final blessing.

Lesson Objective:

To have children understand the sequence of events during the Divine Liturgy, as well as be aware that the consecration is the most important part.

Introduction:

Bible Reading:

Sequence of Events During Divine Liturgy:

- 1. God blesses us through the Priest.
- 2. The Little Entrance is when the Priest comes out with the Gospel.
- We listen to the Priest read the Gospel. It tells us about Jesus' life. We learn how to love God.
- The Great Entrance is when the Priest comes out with the Gifts of bread and wine.
- 5. We recite the Symbol of Faith (the Creed).
- 6. The Priest asks the Holy Spirit to bless us and the bread and wine, and they become the Body and Blood of Jesus. This is the consecration and therefore the most important part of the Divine Liturgy.
- 7. We recite the Lord's Prayer.
- 8. We receive Holy Communion and our hearts are filled with God's love.
- 9. The priest gives us the final blessing.
