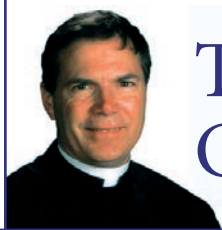

The Pastor's Corner

Catholic Charities and Social Services

As an expression of our faith, the archdiocese serves the poor and vulnerable through two agencies: Catholic Charities of Southwestern Ohio and Catholic Social Services of the Miami Valley. In 2013, our two agencies passed rigorous reviews by the Council on Accreditation and were recognized for providing the highest quality service and for continuous quality improvement across all programs.

We have a long tradition of working to protect human life. Our programs range from the beginning of life (pregnancy counseling and adoption) through the end of life (senior programs and respite care). The 131,000 people we serve annually are faced with a broad range of challenges in their lives—including unemployment, hunger, and immigration issues, to name a few. The needs are very real and growing.

One Faith, One Hope, One Love provides an opportunity for our local Church to lift many who struggle from sliding further into poverty. Through increasing services provided and enabling a higher level of quality service, we will

- Provide specific programming to parishes and the community to reach 25,000 people with the Gospel message to serve the poor.
- Expand care management and enable 32,000 more families to improve their life situations.
- Develop self-sufficiency for many more people through job readiness, literacy, healthy choices, GED, financial skills, and legal services.
- Invest further in parish/community food pantries, nutrition programs, and the Second Harvest Food Bank to deliver an additional 7.5 million meals to reduce hunger.
- Increase volunteer hours by 128,000.
- Increase effectiveness through technology and facility upgrades to serve 67,000 more individuals.

THE READINGS FOR THIS WEEK



PAINS-TAKING PRAYER?

Isaiah 53:10-11 Psalm 33:4-5, 18-20, 22
Hebrews 4:14-16 Mark 10:35-45

"You do not know what you are asking."

— Mark 10:38

The Lord commands us to "confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and favor and to find help in time of need" (Heb 4:16). When we do this, however, we should try to understand the implications of what we are asking (Mk 10:38). If we ask for many to be justified and saved, we are also asking that we share in Christ's redemptive sufferings (Is 53:11; Col 1:24). If we pray for the will of the Lord to be accomplished through us, we are also asking for the grace to give our lives as offerings for sin (Is 53:10). If we ask to be great and do great things for God's kingdom, we are also praying to be the servants, even the slaves, of all (Mk 10:43-44).

When we pray the *Our Father*, the general intercessions at Mass, or other prayers, the Lord will question us before answering our prayers. He asks: "Can you drink the cup I shall drink or be baptized in the same bath of pain as I?" (Mk 10:38) How will we answer? Prayer and pain often go together. Look at Jesus, the crucified Intercessor. Considering the fact that prayer is often done in the shadow of the cross, it's no wonder that so few pray seriously and powerfully. Do we love others so much that we will not only pray for them but also suffer with Jesus for them? Will you drink the cup?

- **Prayer:** *Jesus, may I spend an hour in prayer daily even if I have to pray as You did in the Garden of Gethsemani prior to Calvary.*
- **Promise:** *"The Son of Man has not come to be served but to serve — to give His life in ransom for the many."* —Mk 10:45
- **Praise:** *Praise Jesus, Who became the Suffering Servant of all! Alleluia! Glory to our victorious Lord!*

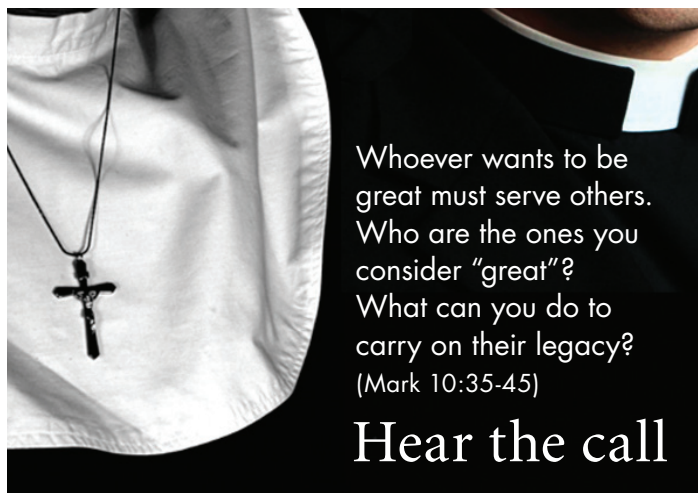


St. Luke wrote one of the major portions of the New Testament, a two-volume work comprising the third Gospel and Acts of the Apostles. In the two books he shows the parallel between the life of Christ and that of the Church. He is the only Gentile Christian among the Gospel writers. Tradition holds him to be a native of Antioch,

and Paul calls him "our beloved physician" (Colossians 4:14). His Gospel was probably written between A.D. 70 and 85.

Luke appears in Acts during Paul's second journey, remains at Philippi for several years until Paul returns from his third journey, accompanies Paul to Jerusalem and remains near him when he is imprisoned in Caesarea. During these two years, Luke had time to seek information and interview persons who had known Jesus. He accompanied Paul on the dangerous journey to Rome where he was a faithful companion. "Only Luke is with me," Paul writes (2 Timothy 4:11).

STEWARDSHIP PRAY, MINISTER, AND GIVE FROM WHAT YOU HAVE

THIS IS STEWARDSHIP MONTH

The month of October is dedicated to a renewal of our stewardship commitment to God through St. Cecilia Parish. *"Yours, LORD, are greatness and might, majesty, victory, and splendor. For all in heaven and on earth is yours."* 1Chronicles 29:11

Stewardship is defined as "the careful and responsible management of something entrusted to one's care—including time, spiritual gifts, talents, and money." Stated another way, **stewardship is faithfully using God's resources to do God's work.**

It is imperative that we maintain a proper view of ownership. All "our" wealth ultimately belongs to God. We are but managers or stewards, not owners, charged with the stewardship of resources God has entrusted to us. We need to joyfully embrace the reality that "God owns it all." Our eager acknowledgement of God's ownership will shift the focus away from a "self" focused materialism to a mindset of, "What does God want me to do with the resources He has entrusted to me?" This week we concentrate on our stewardship of finance. The practice of returning to God one-tenth of the financial resources God provides is a scriptural principle instituted long ago to bless us and build our faith as we obediently and sacrificially give back to Him.

Why give a portion of our tithe to St. Cecilia? We give so that there are resources available in the "storehouse," St. Cecilia Parish, for God's work to be accomplished—building the Kingdom of God in Oakley—providing the opportunities for ministry and prayer.

But, the stewardship of finance also means that we are expected to manage all of the money entrusted to us. Not just the first 10%. Unfortunately, the remaining 90% is often managed how we want to manage it and not how God wants us to manage it. But if we ignore God in all of our finances, we have the wrong attitude towards money. Managing finances according to society's principles often leads to poor financial decisions and painful consequences, such as debt.

As we reflect on how we manage God's money, keep the following principles in mind:

- God is the owner of everything.
- God wants us to manage everything He has entrusted to us His way.

We must be willing to let God be Lord to our financial matters. God should be a part of this and all areas of our lives. God will hold us accountable for how we use the resources He provides.



One Faith, One Hope, One Love provides an opportunity for our local Church to lift many who struggle from sliding further into poverty. Monies will provide specific programming to parishes with the Gospel message to serve the poor, help develop self-sufficiency through job readiness, literacy, healthy choices, GED, financial skills and legal services, and invest in parish food pantries. St. Cecilia's share of the \$130 million campaign goal is \$833,000. **To date we have raised 62% of that goal—\$514,000.** Each household will receive information about the campaign. Please be welcoming when a parish volunteer calls upon you.

October 18 is World Mission Sunday, a day set aside for Catholics worldwide to recommit to the Church's missionary activity in 1,150 dioceses throughout the world. Your generosity makes it possible for those local priests, religious, and catechists to reach out to communities, families and children in desperate need, bringing the light of Christ to the darkest of circumstances.
