THE READINGS FOR THIS WEEK



To Love is Divine

Jeremiah 1:4-5, 17-19 1 Cor 12:31—13:13 Psalm 71:1-6, 15, 17 Luke 4:21-30

"There are in the end three things that last: faith, hope, and love, and the greatest of these is love."

– 1 Corinthians 13:13

If we have not love, we are nothing (1 Cor 13:2). If we have not love, our best efforts are useless (1 Cor 13:3). "The man without love has known nothing of God, for God is Love" (1 Jn 4:8). "The man who does not love is among the living dead" (1 Jn 3:14). Life without love is death. We must have love.

However, it is humanly impossible for us to truly love. It seems that we are able to love some people almost naturally. However, without divine intervention, either this is not true love or God is helping us love without us knowing it. To love is divine. Even the various expressions of love are divine. For example, "to err is human, to forgive is divine."

To love, we must realize the necessity of love and its impossibility by human powers. Then we will ask the Lord to give us the miracle of love. He will do this by loving us first (1 Jn 4:19) and purifying us through obedience to the truth (1 Pt 1:22). Love is the fruit of a great, multi-faceted work of the Spirit (Gal 5:22). He graces us with faith, virtue, discernment, self-control, perseverance, piety, care for our brothers and sisters, and finally love (2 Pt 1:5-7). Love is a miracle resulting from a series of miracles. To act from a heart of love, that is, charity, is also a miracle. To love is divine.

Ask God for love several times a day. He is the only Source of love, for He is Love (1 Jn 4:16).

- **Prayer:** Father, may I receive Your love and grow in Your love so I can give love and act out of charity.
- Promise: "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I dedicated you." —Jer 1:5
- **Praise:** Praise You, risen Jesus, soon to come in glory. Be glorified in our lives. Alleluia!


Saint Agnes (d. ~258)

Almost nothing is known of this saint except that she was very young—12 or 13—when she was martyred in the last half of the third century. Various modes of death have been suggested—beheading, burning, strangling.



Legend has it that Agnes was a beautiful girl whom many young men wanted to marry. Among those she refused, one reported her to the authorities for being a Christian. She was arrested and confined to a house of prostitution. The legend continues that a man who looked upon her lustfully lost his sight and had it restored by

her prayer. Agnes was condemned, executed and buried near Rome in a catacomb that eventually was named after her. The daughter of Constantine built a basilica in her honor. — www.americancatholic.org



Palms to Be Collected



On Wednesday, Jan. 27, the Archdiocese of Cincinnati participated in a press conference where it was announced that St. Cecilia School has been awarded a \$500,000 grant through Seton Education Partners, a nonprofit organization committed to reviving and expanding opportunities for children in urban settings to receive an academically excellent and vibrantly Catholic education.

St. Cecilia School will be collaborating with Seton Education Partners (www.setonpartners.org) to help our students reach their full potential. This initiative will invest in excess of a half million dollars in our school and our students as it will help transform St. Cecilia into a blended learning academy that will achieve outstanding academic and character growth outcomes for our students. Seton's nationally recognized program places an emphasis on the interplay between personalized software and data-driven, small-group instruction. The investment in our school will include new computers, tech infrastructure, materials, digital content, and training for teachers and staff.

The faculty, staff, and I have spent close to a year pursuing this initiative, and we are excited to have been chosen to work with Seton Education Partners and become one of only a dozen schools within their network nationally. We are confident that utilizing a teaching model that fosters individual learning by bridging traditional and small-group instruction with enhanced technology will improve student achievement at all levels.

This partnership is made possible through a generous grant from Accelerate Great Schools, an organization that shares Seton's and St. Cecilia's passion for student success. Accelerate Great Schools provides much needed funding to kickstart innovative educational programs that have demonstrated great results.

This is wonderful news for our school! The selection process was very competitive, and we feel blessed to have this opportunity as we see the potential for it to inspire and help each and every one of our school children.




