## A GOSPEL REFLECTION by Father Jason Williams

MATTHEW 13:44-46

"He sells all that he has and buys the field."

The Kingdom of Heaven has already been ushered in, yet it is not fulfilled. That reality leaves us Christians on mission in the world in a state of joyful anticipation. We are joyful because through the incarnation and Paschal Mystery of Jesus Christ the way to salvation has already been opened and the forces of evil and the pain of sin and death have already

been overcome, but their effects are not yet fully wiped away. We anticipate the joys of eternal life, while enduring the trials of life in a redeemed but still wounded world. The fleeting joys of this life, even those that are the clearest reflections of the everlasting joys of heaven, always leave us unsatisfied and seeking something greater. That perfect fulfillment of all our desires will only be given us in heaven as we behold our Father face-to-face.

The true joys of the Kingdom, whether those we experience now as a foretaste of the things to come or those that we will be given by God perfectly in heaven, are the treasure buried in the field and the pearl of great price. In their essence the goods of the Kingdom — the heavenly treasures our hearts should be set on — are those things that afford us a share in the life of God on this earth and the fullness of participation in his being in heaven. They are more valuable than anything else we can possess because they come as gifts from God, allowing us to live in union with him, to live a life of grace. Let us thank God for all the gifts of his grace, the treasures of his Kingdom: the sacraments, the corporal and spiritual works of mercy, the prayers and devotions of our Church, the virtues of the heart of Christ.

Why can there be only one Church? Just as there is only one Christ, there can be only one Body of Christ, only one Bride of Christ, and therefore only one Church of Jesus Christ. He is the Head, the Church is the Body. Together they form the "whole Christ" (St. Augustine). Just as the body has many members yet is one, so too the one Church consists of and is made up of many particular churches (dioceses). Together they form the whole Christ. [811-816, 866, 870]


Jesus built his Church on the foundation of the Apostles. This foundation supports her to this day. The faith of the apostles was handed down from generation to generation under the leadership of the Pope, the Petrine ministry, "which presides in charity" (St. Ignatius of Antioch). The Sacraments, too, which Jesus entrusted to the apostolic college, still work with their original power. (**YOUCAT question 129**)

## COMING THIS FALL: The Reformation, with Msgr. Frank Lane

This year marks the 500th anniversary of the formal explosion that took place in Wittenburg, Saxony, on October 31, 1517.

Join with us as Msgr. Lane revisits this phenomenon in an attempt to help us understand more completely what happened and what it means for us today. The "unintended" secular consequences have a long and deep precedent in the western world for, in the end, the Reformation was not about "Who is God?" but "Who are humans, i.e., who are we?" The whole question of human/Christian anthropology was exploded and has, over the centuries, cast a dark shadow over civilization. We will look at the events of the revolution and explore its consequences, especially in Western society.





#### Meet the Saints

St. Ignatius of Loyola (1491 - 1556)

St. Ignatius was known as a fancy dresser, expert dancer, womanizer, sensitive to insult, and involved in criminal behavior. At the age of seventeen, he became a knight and was eventually wounded in battle.

During his long convalescence, he read a collection of saint biographies and a copy of *Life of Christ*. These books profoundly affected him and he experienced a conversion of heart. He desired to pattern his life after the great saints and during this time he formulated his famous Spiritual Exercises, the spiritual centerpiece of the religious order he would establish.

During his study he gathered a group of six like-minded men and founded the Society of Jesus, today known as the Jesuits. He centered his spiritual life on the essential foundations of Christianity — the Trinity, Christ, and the Eucharist. His spirituality is expressed in the Jesuit motto *ad majorem Dei gloriam* — "for the greater glory of God."
