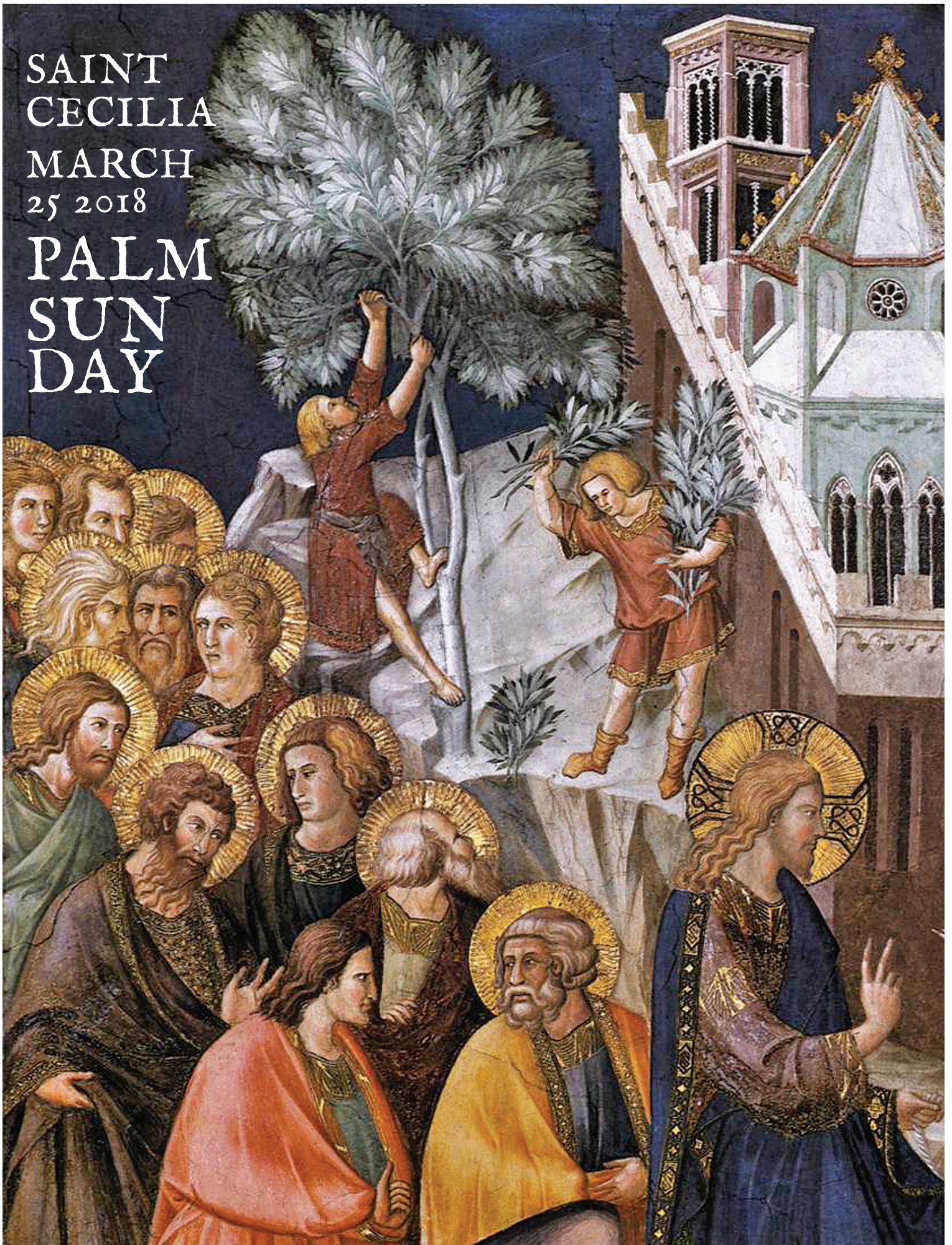

Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday is the start of Passion Week. This is a very significant week, as it depicts the last week of Christ's life as man. On Palm Sunday, we reflect on the day Jesus entered the city to celebrate Passover. The crowd spread their palm branches down for him as he entered triumphantly. They shouted, "Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord."

When we begin our Mass on Palm Sunday, we start with blessing the palms and then we process in with them. The Passion is read as a very powerful Gospel reading to prepare us for Holy Week. This is a time to reflect on Jesus' agony. To ponder what he went through for us, and then to prepare us for his glorious resurrection.

If you haven't had a chance to go to confession yet, we will hear confessions after daily Mass on Monday through Wednesday and after Morning Prayers on Thursday through Saturday. We will also hear them after Holy Thursday Mass, after Good Friday service and on Saturday at 3:00 PM.

It would be wonderful to see parishioners attend the Holy Week Masses and Services.

A Gospel Reflection

MARK 11:1-10

*"Blessed is he who comes in the name
of the Lord."*

4 Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem is one of the Gospel passages most familiar to us. The fact that we celebrate it in such a special way each year helps to leave a better impression of the scene in our memory — and in our hearts.

We see Jesus well aware of the situation. He gives very specific instructions to his disciples, and all comes to pass as he had said. In organizing his entry into the city he could have made a huge spectacle of the thing, yet he is content with riding on a donkey while some of the bystanders sing psalms.

Two aspects of Jesus' personality are very clear in this episode: his freedom and willingness to do the Father's will and his humility. The two are related. He wants to do the Father's will — even when it's difficult — because he knows that everything he has comes from the Father. He trusts that what the Father wants is best for him because he knows that all that the Father does is motivated by the purest of love.

The Father loves each of us the same way. What better evidence do we have of that than the example Jesus set for us in the events he underwent this week: giving himself fully in the Eucharist, laying down his life on the Cross to redeem us from our sinfulness, and resting in the hope of the resurrection. He gives everything for love of us; what more can I still give for love of Him?

Credo (I Believe)

"Not My Will, but Yours Be Done"

The week that begins with Palm Sunday contains what are sometimes called the "High Holy Days" of Christianity. They are called this because they commemorate the last days of the life of Jesus as he goes from the Last Supper to the tomb and contain the most sacred moments of Christian history.

While there are many aspects of this week that we can look at, our focus in this reflection is on the Garden of Gethsemane. After the Last Supper, Jesus goes to the Garden to pray and prepare for what lies ahead. Knowing that he will be facing incredible suffering, he prays to the Father, asking that if it is possible that the "cup" he must drink could pass.

In these moments, we see Jesus, the man. He is fearful and anxious, even to the point of sweating blood. Yet, he unites his human will — which dreads the coming events — with his Father's and is able to not just passively acquiesce to his Passion but embrace it. He doesn't deny his pain, but unites it to the Father in an act of perfect love.

The lesson is clear for us. We all are called to love God and do the Father's will, even when it is difficult. But love involves sacrifice — dying to self and making sacrifices for the ones we love. Indeed, love demands that we sometimes do things we don't want to do to serve the good of others. We can use the example of Christ in the Garden to accept our crosses as well.

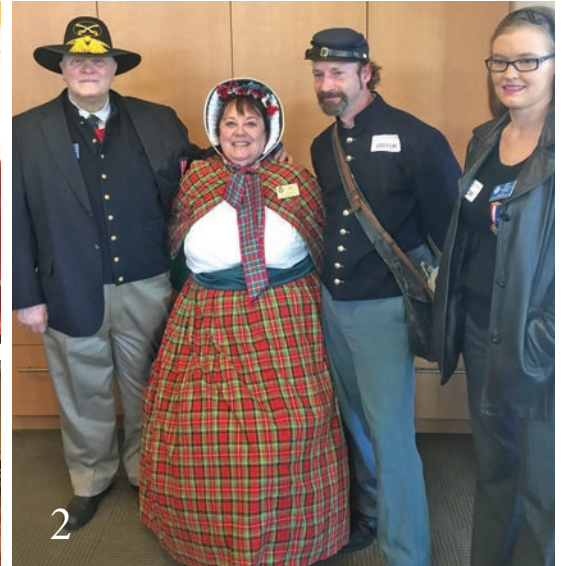

Fast and Abstinence Guidelines for Holy Week

- Persons ages 14 and up are to abstain from eating meat on Good Friday.
- Persons ages 18-59 are to fast on Good Friday. When fasting, you are allowed one full meal a day. Two other light meals are permitted, but eating between meals is not permitted. Liquids are allowed at any time.
- If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection.

The Flowering Cross

During Holy Week, there will be a bare wooden cross standing outside the Madison Road church entrance. This is a reminder of Christ's suffering and death. On Easter morning, that cross will be
