at the College of Saint John Vianney in Miami, Florida. Please



SUMMER WITH THE SAINTS St. Pio of Pietrelcina


Born in 1887 in the small village of Pietrelcina in the south of Italy, Francesco Forgione joined the Order of Franciscan Capuchins at age fifteen and took the name Pio. Ordained seven years later, he was assigned to the monastery of San Giovanni Ro-

tondo in his village.

On August 5, 1918, Padre Pio received the Stigmata, the wounds of Christ, on his body, which he carried for half a century. He was especially afflicted while celebrating Holy Mass each day. It appeared he suffered as Jesus did while He was on the Cross, losing much blood from his wounds. He would always offer up these sufferings for the salvation of the world.

For fifty years, Padre Pio, as he came to be known, was a much sought-after spiritual advisor, confessor, and intercessor whose life was devoted to the Eucharist and prayer. People came from all over the world to see him celebrate Mass and seek his help. Late in life, he was able to open a "House To Relieve Suffering," where both the physical and spiritual needs of people were met.

After his death in 1968, Padre Pio was beatified in 1999 by Pope St. John Paul II and canonized by him just three years later in 2002.
