### Hail, holy Queen, Mother of Mercy. Hail our life, our sweetness and our hope.



On Thursday, Catholics around the world mark the feast of the Assumption of Mary, commemorating the end of her earthly life and assumption into Heaven. But while the feast day is a relatively new one, the history of the holiday — and the mystery behind it — has its roots in the earliest centuries of Christian belief. As her earthly life comes to an end, her Assumption helps us to understand more fully not just her life, but it helps us to always focus our gaze to eternity. The dogma of the Assumption of Mary has its roots in the early centuries of the Church. The Catholic Church teaches that when Mary ended her earthly life, God assumed her, body and soul into heaven. According to St. John of Damascus, in the 5th century, the Roman Emperor Marcian requested the body of Mary, Mother of God. St. Juvenal, who was Bishop of Jerusalem replied "that Mary died in the presence of all the Apostles, but that her tomb, when opened upon the request of St. Thomas, was found empty; wherefrom the Apostles concluded that the body was taken up to heaven." In 1950, Pope Pius XII made an infallible, ex-cathedra statement: "By the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, of the Blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and by our own authority, we pronounce, declare, and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory."

The Feast of the Assumption is a Holy Day of Obligation, and Catholics are required to attend Mass. We have Masses at all the parishes in the region: We have a vigil Mass at St. Anthony on Wednesday, Aug. 14, at 7 PM, as well as Masses on the feast day itself at St. Cecilia at 9 AM, 12:10 PM, and 5:30 PM, and at SM-SJ at 11:45 AM.

Amen?Amen!

Wednesday, August 21 @ 7pm
















### Letter to a Suffering Church Bishop Barron Speaks on the Sexual Abuse Crisis




