### Catechesis (kat'i-ke'sis) n.

### The Chasuble

The chasuble is the vestment proper to he who celebrates the Holy Mass. In the past the liturgical books used the two Latin terms "casual" and "planeta" synonymously. While the term "planeta" was especially used in Rome and has remained in use in Italy, the term "casula" derives from the typical form of the vestment that at the beginning completely covered the sacred minister who wore it. The Latin "casula" is found in other languages in a modified form. Thus one finds "casulla" in Spanish, "chasuble" in French and English, and "Kasel" in German.

The prayer for the donning of the chasuble references the exhortation in the Letter to the Colossians (3:14) — "Above all these things [put on] charity, which

is the bond of perfection" — and the Lord's words in Matthew, 11:30: "O Lord, who has said, My yoke is sweet and My burden light," grant that I may so carry it as to merit Thy grace."

During Lent, we will pray the Stations of the Cross every Friday at 9:30 AM and 7 PM at St. Cecilia and on Thursdays after the 5:30 PM Mass at St. Mary. During this special devotion, through meditation and prayer, we will walk with our Savior on his way of suffering from the time he was condemned to death until he died and



was buried. Making this devotion part of your Lenten commitment to prayer will help you grow closer to Christ.

### **Know Your Saints**

### St. Adrian of Canterbury (d. 710)

Though St. Adrian turned down a papal request to become Archbishop of Canterbury, England, Pope St. Vitalian accepted the rejection on the condition that Adrian serve as the Holy Father's assistant and adviser. Adrian accepted, but ended up spending most of his life and doing most of his work in Canterbury.

Born in Africa, Adrian was serving as an abbot in Italy when the new Archbishop of Canterbury appointed him abbot of the monastery of Sts. Peter and Paul in Canterbury. Thanks to his leadership skills, the facility became one of the most important centers of learning. The school attracted many outstanding scholars from far and wide and produced numerous future bishops and archbishops. Students reportedly learned Greek and Latin and spoke Latin as well as their own native languages.

Adrian taught at the school for 40 years. He died there, probably in the year 710, and was buried in the monastery. Several hundred years later, when reconstruction was being done, Adrian's body was discovered in an incorrupt state. As word spread, people flocked to his tomb, which became famous for miracles. Rumor had it that young schoolboys in trouble with their masters made regular visits there.



### Why Antiphons?

Since the beginning of Advent and the use of *The Pew Missal* as our worship aid, we are now incorporating the Entrance and **Communion Antiphons** into the liturgy.

The parts of Mass that we sing fall into two main categories: the Ordinary and the Propers. The Ordinary consists of the parts of the Mass with unchanging words: the Kyrie, Gloria, Creed, Holy Holy, Memorial Acclamation, and Lamb of God. Each part of the Ordinary is our direct response as the people of God to some action or prayer in the liturgy.

The Propers are the parts of the Mass with words that change depending on the day. They consist of scripture passages given to us on which to meditate. There are Propers assigned to

the Entrance, Responsorial Psalm, Gospel Acclamation, Offertory and Communion. It's important to note that the antiphons are scripture. In the Mass, the incarnate Word of God comes in our midst. It's fitting that our meditation should be that same Word.

We are incorporating antiphons into the Entrance and Communion times, in addition to the Responsorial Psalm and Gospel Acclamation as a way of moving towards singing Propers. After Vatican II, none of the antiphons that the Church provided had English versions, so vernacular hymns were used to fill the void, developing into the FOUR-HYMN MASS. By including the sung Propers we are finally beginning to sing the Mass as was prescribed by Vatican II.

You are encouraged to sing the antiphons. At the beginning of Mass, the lector announces the page number where the Mass of the day begins. Join in singing the Entrance antiphon. During the communion procession, join in singing the repeated antiphon as a part of your meditation.
