VOTE FOR LIFE. VOTE YES.

A special election in August will ask voters to decide whether the threshold to amend the Ohio Constitution should be elevated from a simple majority to a 60% "yes" vote. The best strategy to stop the abortion amendment is to **vote** "Yes" on August 8.

HELP PROTECT THE DIGNITY OF LIFE IN OHIO


Life in its earliest and most vulnerable stages is threatened by groups proposing an amendment to the Ohio Constitution to expand and enshrine abortion at the expense of protections for preborn children and women. The Catechism of the Catholic Church proclaims that "human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception." The Church accompanies and supports women facing unexpected pregnancies and mothers through programs like *Walking with Moms in Need* and the services of Catholic Charities.

The bishops of Ohio strongly encourage Catholics statewide to unite in prayer and work to defeat this proposed amendment and its grave consequences for women and preborn children in Ohio.

Getting the pro-life vote to the polls will be key to protecting Ohio's Constitution from outside dark money groups that want to enshrine abortion through all nine months while taking away parental rights, as well as advancing the transgender agenda.




