THE PASTOR'S CORNER

First Communion

First Communion is one of the most significant milestones in a Catholic's spiritual life, marking a child's first reception of the Eucharist. The Eucharist, or Holy Communion, is one of the seven sacraments of the Catholic Church and is considered the "source and summit" of a Catholic's life. This month, St. Cecilia and St. Mary will have many children receiving their First Communions. These children will be strengthening their relationship with God. The children have all entered the church through Baptism, and now they are in full participation in the life of the church at their First Communion. Each week, they will be able to engage in this part of the liturgy. I can't say it enough to the parents of these children that while this is the first time they receive the Eucharist, it should not be the last. They will be partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ every weekend as they fulfill their obligation to attend Mass. The children have reached a deeper understanding of Jesus' sacrifice. I know after a long week of work and school, it may seem like one more thing for them to prepare for Mass on the weekend. Now that the children have learned what Jesus' sacrifice has given them, the children are going to want to receive the Eucharist each week with their community. Please be supportive and get them to Mass, so that they can be part of the full participation they have been granted.

May is Foster Care Awareness Month

As a parish that proclaims a deep commitment to the dignity of every human life, we are called not only to protect life in the womb, but to care for the vulnerable children already among us—especially those without families to love and care for them.

Today, there are over 16,000 children in foster care in the state of Ohio. Many of these children have been separated from their siblings or placed in group homes because there simply aren't enough foster families to take them in. The need is great and foster care is an essential, yet frequently overlooked pro life issue.



There are many ways to help:

1. Become a licensed foster parent.
2. Support foster families by becoming a licensed alternative or respite care provider (help with transportation, childcare, babysitting, etc.).
3. Donate needed items such as clothing and toys. When children are moved between placements, they often lose everything they have.

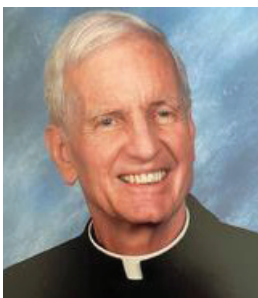

Rest in peace, Fr. David Robisch

Fr. David Robisch passed away on Saturday, May 3, at the age of 87 after a years-long struggle with Parkinson's disease.

He was ordained to the priesthood on December 22, 1962 by Archbishop Karl J. Alter after studying at St. Gregory and Mount St. Mary Seminaries and completing graduate studies at Xavier University. He taught at Elder High School and served as Assistant Director at the University of Cincinnati's Newman Center. From 1965 to 1970, he was Secretary to Bishop Edward A. McCarthy and Assistant Chancellor for the archdiocese. The following ten years were spent as Spiritual Director at St. Gregory Seminary.

He served at many parishes before being named pastor of St. Mary Hyde Park in 1991 where he served until 2007. Rest in peace, good and faithful servant.
