# Message from Our Pastor

#### Dear Parish Family,

Jesus' care for the Church He will found in the gospel is indicated by today's gospel. He will feed his Church on his word and sacrament through history by having his apostles and their successors minister to great numbers of people.

#### EXEGESIS:

Because Jesus is in sorrow after hearing about the execution of his cousin and friend, John the Baptist, He withdraws to a private place for prayer. When He returns in a boat, and even though He is still sad, He is stricken with compassion for the crowd awaiting Him, and He begins to cure the sick.

He then performs the only miracle mentioned in all four gospels. He multiplies only five loaves of bread and two fish to feed over 5,000 people in the field. The story has a strong Last Supper/Eucharistic theme. The initial bread and fish total seven items, already a sacred number in Judaism, indicating something mysterious will happen. It is evening, the same time as the Last Supper. Jesus blesses and breaks the bread, the same as He will do the night before He dies. Matthew does not specifically mention the distribution of the fish, probably because it would no longer fit into the Eucharistic theme.

As at the Last Supper, Jesus prepares his apostles for their own ministry of feeding the Church on his own word and sacrament by having them give the food to the crowd. The twelve baskets of leftovers symbolize the special role of the twelve apostles in the early Church and the abundance of God's generosity. Even before Jesus multiplied the food, He had told the apostles for they themselves to feed the crowd, indicating He was training these men to take care of his followers.

Besides the Last Supper theme, an eschatological theme arises, symbolized also by the women and children who are not counted. That is, at the great Eucharistic banquet at the end of time, God will gather a great number of the blessed from everywhere to feast at his heavenly table. *Fr. Chris Ferrer* – Pastor
