Message from our Pastor

In today's gospel, Jesus encounters basic rejection by his home town of Nazareth. This incident gives us insight into his family background and his understanding of his person and mission.

EXEGESIS:

Jesus briefly returns to his native town of Nazareth and teaches. The people there marvel at his wisdom and at stories of his miracles. Yet, surprisingly, most of them do not believe in Him. They reject "the local boy makes good" idea, because they know his humble background and poor family. In Jewish society, a man was known as the son of his father, so it is unusual here that Jesus is described as the socially inferior "son of Mary." Perhaps Joseph is dead by this time; or maybe Mark is repeating the insultive term which was publicly used; or this might be an indication of Mark's admiration for Mary. Only Mark describes Jesus himself as a "carpenter" (or literally, "a craftsman," not necessarily a carpenter). Mark repeats the use of the Hebrew "brothers" and "sisters" in his Greek, which mean "nephews, nieces, half-siblings, cousins" as well as "siblings." Thus Jesus' siblings would be Joseph's children from his possible prior marriage, or would be Jesus' cousins (extended families lived together in those days). Interestingly, the lack of faith of most of the townspeople prevents Jesus from working miracles there; He will not impose himself on them (and us) if we are not willing to accept Him. And Jesus identifies himself with the Old Testament prophets, implying his future rejection and death.
