Pope Francis' Rosary to End the Pandemic: The Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception has been chosen by the Holy See to lead the worldwide recitation of the Rosary on **Monday, May 17, at 11am CT/12 noon ET/6pm Rome** time, in response to Pope Francis' call for a "marathon" of prayer during the month of May "to ask for the end of the pandemic." Cardinal Wilton Gregory, Archbishop of Washington and Chairman of the National Shrine Board of Trustees, will prayerfully lead the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary from the Basilica's Great Upper Church. The recitation of the Rosary will be live streamed at www.nationalshrine.org/mass and will be shared with the Holy See for transmission throughout the world.
