

Incoming Third Grade Summer Homework:

Required Reading Homework: Everyone will read *Flat Stanley: His Original Adventure* by Jeff Brown. You can buy this book if you want, or your child can read it on Epic! You need to sign up for a free account and your child will be able to read it on a computer or a device. You will get an email from Epic! with instructions on how to set up your child's account. Since your child is still learning how to read, this is a book that should be read together. Please take turns reading it to one another. We will do some activities with this book when school starts.

In addition to the assigned book, students need to be reading for at least 20 minutes a day. The most important part of summer reading is that they are reading out loud to someone for at least 10 minutes of their 20-minute reading time. Reading out loud can also be done by reading a picture book to a sibling or a parent. Color in the calendar each day you read. Write down the title and author of the books you read on the attached "reading log."

Students should be choosing picture books or beginning chapter books that they can read fluently.

Required Math Homework: Complete Math Fluency Log to practice addition and subtraction facts, playing with and adding up money, telling time to the minute on a clock, playing Prodigy, and problem solving with math.

Suggested Skills to practice:

Neat print Handwriting. Cursive letters were introduced but will be worked on a practiced during 3rd grade.

Math Log

Third Graders need to practice their Math facts and other math skills for about 45 minutes a week. It is best to spread it out and vary what you are doing. Play XtraMath and Prodigy, quiz the student with flash cards, have the roll a dice and

add, subtract the numbers, turn numbers into a game while playing basketball or soccer, give timed tests, etc. Student should be able to answer the question in about 3 seconds for it to be mastered.
