Throughout the scriptures, Jesus continually calls the people back to the Covenant to take care of the poor, the afflicted, the outcast and the stranger. He chastises the leaders of the Temple for paying more attention to the laws of religious observance than to attending to the needs of the people. We are called to do the same. Giving from our substance to help those in need is what the Church means by the "preferential option for the poor". There are many needs in our world today, especially for those suffering medical, physical and financial hardship as well as the plight of the homeless and the refugees. Beyond our borders there are many suffering the ravages of war, violence, poverty, and famine. The human needs are still very real. We cannot solve all of the problems of the needy, but Christ asks as to do our best to reach out in compassion to those who are less fortunate.

Advent begins next Sunday. It is a time of transition from expecting Christ's coming back at the end of time to awaiting his coming at Christmas. Christ becomes a member of our human family so that we may become members of his divine family. As we prepare for the holidays, don't rush into Christmas. I invite all of you to take time to participate in the season of Advent. It is a time of joyful expectation that has great spiritual rewards and consolations. # SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD, CHRIST THE KING ~ SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

The celebration of the Solemnity of Christ the King marks the end of the Church's liturgical year. Our scriptures tell us about the Second Coming, when Christ returns in glory. This celebration announces the end of time. When Christ returns, the world will end. The reflection on "last things" gives us a horizon or background against which to evaluate our lives. Whether God calls us home in death or Christ comes back first, we will all have to make an accounting to God. How have we lived, what have we done with the time we had on this earth, how have we treated one another? How do we measure up to the values we profess?

Ezekiel tells us that the Lord God will rescue his people from every scattered place and give them rest. The lost will be sought out, and those who have strayed will be brought back. The injured and sick will be healed. St. Paul writes to a divided Corinthian community, which seems to have strayed from the faith. He tells them that Christ, risen from the dead, will come back to reign in glory and will subject everything to himself. He will destroy death, and those who belong to him will be brought to eternal life. In the gospel reading, Jesus says that when he comes back in glory all the nations will be assembled before him and they will be separated, the good from the bad. Those who have taken care of the hungry and the suffering will inherit the kingdom. Those who denied help to the needy will be cursed and cast into the fire of eternal punishment.

In today's gospel, Jesus tells us that those who will inherit the kingdom of God are those who have recognized him in the least of our brothers and sisters. Jesus speaks directly about helping the poor, the sick and the stranger. Last week we were told that we are to be good stewards of the talents that we have been given. Today Christ reminds us that the gifts we have been given are to be used to help one another. This is how God will measure us when he calls us home.

One of the biggest gifts we can give back to God is to treat the least among us with the dignity we would give to Christ himself, to recognize in them the divine image in which they, too, were created. It is often very hard to see Christ in the faces of those we dislike or those who are different. I sometimes have difficulty seeing Christ in many people, not only in the violent, the criminal, and the panhandlers; but also the unkind, the selfish, the rude and those people who have treated me unjustly. But the gospel helps me to shift my vision and pray for the courage to try to be the compassion of Christ for them, even when I don't feel like it and even though I don't always succeed.



We also bought and distributed pens, playing cards, word search books, calendars, hats, gloves, and socks to the families and individuals housed at the center.

# Feast Day of St. Andrew November 30

St. Andrew demonstrated his love for his brother as well as his apostolic zeal when, convinced that Jesus was the Messiah, he sought out St. Peter. "Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus.

He first found his own brother Simon and told him, 'we have found the Messiah.' Then he brought him to Jesus." (Jn. 1:40-42) Andrew and his brother Simon Peter were the first of Jesus' 12 disciples.

St. Andrew is the patron saint of fishermen and singers. He is also the patron saint to several countries and cities including: Scotland, Romania, Russia, Ukraine and Patras.

#### Save the best for last

The film industry has always had a love affair with the afterlife. From It's a Wonderful Life to Heaven Can Wait to Ghost to Flatliners, stories remind us that our choices in this world have ramifications in the next. More recent shows—Dead Like Me, The Good Life, After Life, and Hotel del Luna among many others—are less traditionally religious but no less curious about what comes next. Every culture and generation seems to sense the need for spirit guides and guardians, as well as justice and an hour of reckoning. As the church year closes, contemplate the ledger of your years. Does it add up to a heavenly ending?

#### Conversion can be revolutionary

British poet Alice Meynell, who died on this day in 1922, converted to Catholicism while recovering from chronic illness, and her writing thereafter turned to religious subjects. She married a Catholic newspaper publisher and founded a Catholic suffragist organization. When a British priest preached against giving women the right to vote because it would risk "bringing a revolution of the first magnitude," Meynell replied, "...the vaster the magnitude of the revolution, the better." One hundred years after her death, the struggle for equality continues. How do the teachings of Jesus inform your work for justice?

# Little lamb, who made thee?

Happy birthday to the English poet William Blake, born this day in 1757. Though not Catholic, he's inspired great Catholic poets and many of his poems—like "Jerusalem"—became hymns. Trappist monk Thomas Merton wrote his master's thesis on Blake, emphasizing his spiritual significance in *Seven Storey Mountain*: "His rebellion ... was fundamentally the rebellion of the saints. It was the rebellion of the lover of the living God, the rebellion of the one whose desire of God was so intense and irresistible that it condemned, with all its might, all the hypocrisy and petty sensuality and skepticism and materialism" of organized religion. Pray for all who search for God but find obstacles in religious institutions—and enjoy Blake's "The Lamb."

# Gracious encounters of the digital kind

Did you buy anything on Cyber Monday? Did you make a charitable donation yesterday, on Giving Tuesday? Whether you did or not, this week's digital focus continues today, which is recognized as Electronic Greetings Day. Pope Francis' 2020

encyclical *Fratelli Tutti* considers how the internet is a powerful tool and how it's our job to use it in a way that makes the world better. "We need constantly to ensure that present-day forms of communication are in fact guiding us to generous encounter with others," he writes. Make time today to send an encouraging email or ecard to someone who needs to hear from you.

Is there an Andy, Andre, or Andrea in your life? Whether they know it or not, they bear the name of the Apostle Andrew, one of the fishermen Jesus famously called to be "fishers of men." The Eastern church recognizes Andrew as the first to be called by Jesus. Tradition has it that Andrew was crucified on an X-shaped cross because he felt unworthy to die on a cross identical to Christ's. Andrew led the way in accepting Jesus' invitation to follow him. How will your life today respond to that invitation?

# Compassionate in the face of controversy

St. Vincent Medical Center in Manhattan, now closed, was in the eye of the AIDS epidemic storm of the 1980s and 1990s. A Catholic hospital run by the Sisters of Charity, St. Vincent opened its doors to care for those who were sick and dying from AIDS. Some staff disagreed with this stance and left. But not the sisters. They stayed true to Jesus' command to care for the suffering, especially those cast aside by society. They entered into dialogue with the gay community, activists, and hospital administrators to better understand their patients and how best to serve them. May we remember their unwavering commitment and compassion—and do likewise.

# Be a freedom fighter

The term *modern slavery* covers practices such as forced labor, debt bondage, forced marriage, and human trafficking ... situations of exploitation enforced by violence, coercion, or deception. Here's the shocking news: Modern slavery has increased significantly in the past five years. Ten million more people, largely women and children, were trapped in modern slavery in 2021 compared to 2016, bringing the total estimate to 50 million worldwide. Our God is a God of freedom, who releases us from bondage of all kinds. On this U.N. International Day for the Abolition of Slavery, raise your voice in a phone call, email, or letter to elected officials. Let's put an end to this!
