oday we celebrate the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Today's scriptures tell us of a compassionate God who comes to us in times of trouble. In the first reading, Job is beset by great tragedies. St. Paul tells the Corinthians of the great hardships he endures for the sake of the gospel. And in the gospel reading, Jesus heals the sick, drives out demons and proclaims the reign of God through Galilee. Our faith tells us that when we trust in God, he will come to us to heal us, to give us strength to endure the trials of this world and deliver us from evil. St. Paul reminds us that living in faith will not always be easy; but if we sacrifice ourselves for the good of others, we too, will receive our heavenly inheritance.

We experienced a loss of heat in the **Divine Infant Church** recently due to problems with the boiler. Fortunately, that has been fixed and the church is warm again. Thankfully, only minor repairs were needed.

The Annual Catholic Appeal begins next weekend, February 10-11. Our theme this year is "Together at the table", reminding us that in the Eucharist all are welcome at the table of the Lord, and calling us to unity in the Body of Christ. The pledging process will take place during all the Masses when we hear the Cardinal's homily. The in-pew pledging process will be completed the following weekend, February 17-18. Those people who have donated in the past should have received this year's information in the mail directly from the Archbishop's office. Materials on the Appeal are available in both churches and at the rectory. Most of these funds support Catholic education, capital needs for poor parishes, aid to the poor and archdiocesan support ministries.

Thank you to all who worked hard to make our Family Mass, School Open House and Book Fair successful. Nearly 300 people joined us at the family Mass, with beautiful music led by the Children's Choir and Hand Chimes, student lectors, greeters, ushers and servers. The Open House and Book Fair were well attended, including several prospective families who came to tour the school. It was a great opportunity to see the great work our students are doing.

The Finance Committee has reviewed the **Semi-Annual Report** for the first six months of the year through December. Results will be published in the bulletin next week.

The First Reconciliation practice was held yesterday. We will be celebrating the Sacrament of First Reconciliation with thirty-six students this Saturday, February 10th at the Divine Providence Church. Please keep the children and their families in your prayers.

The Confirmation Retreat will be held on February 24th for the twenty-nine students preparing to receive the sacrament in March. Please keep these young people, their sponsors and families in your prayers.





FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The first reading from the book of Job today sounds very depressing. "Is not man's life on earth a drudgery?" asks Job. He ends with the words, "I shall not see happiness again." What is significant in the story is that Job openly and honestly addresses God, revealing his strong faith. St. Paul tells the Corinthians his obligation. He has been given the task to preach the gospel, even at great personal hardship, and pronounces, "woe to me if I do not preach it!" Paul preaches so that he, too, may have a share in the promise of the gospel. The gospel of Mark matter-of-factly portrays the happenings of Jesus. He goes to Peter's house and cures his mother-in-law who then waited on them. After sunset Jesus cured many who were sick and, rising early, went off to pray. His disciples found him and together they went out to preach and heal in the whole of Galilee. Woven throughout the scriptures today are people, not asleep, but intimately involved in life.

FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME ~ SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

Today's scriptures tell us of a compassionate God who comes to us in times of trouble. In the first reading, Job is beset by great tragedies. St. Paul tells the Corinthians of the great hardships he endures for the sake of the gospel. And in the gospel reading, Jesus heals the sick, drives out demons and proclaims the reign of God through Galilee.

In our current climate of violence in our cities, the influx of a large number of immigrants and refugees, the increasingly hostile polarization of society and politics, particularly in an election year, and the continued economic uncertainty, we can all feel like Job when he proclaims that he has been assigned months of misery, that his days come to an end without hope that he shall ever see happiness again. He is crying out to God in his anguish. The story of Job confronts us with the question of why God permits suffering. Although we will never know the direct answer, Job can help us to shift our focus. In the midst of suffering, we can continue to trust in God. The deeper meaning has to do with our understanding of God. If God is only a provider of worldly benefits, then suffering makes no sense. But if he is our Redeemer who has a salvific plan for us for all eternity, then we *can* persevere in faith in spite of suffering.

In this short passage from Job, we don't hear God's response or get the rest of the story. However, the Book of Job offers us several important lessons. First, Job has a good relationship with God that allows him to talk to God openly, honestly and even to question God's will when he doesn't understand it. He doesn't understand why evil has befallen him because he is a righteous man. Second, Job never wavers in his trust in God, even though God not only doesn't answer him directly, but also tells him that why he suffers is *none of his business*. Third, the tragedies that befall Job are worse than most of us will ever experience: great physical illness, the loss of all his wealth, the ridicule of the community, the abduction of his daughters, and the *death of all his children*. While not making light of our own difficulties, this can help us gain perspective. Many people suffer greatly in this world. The final lesson in the Book of Job is that God does deliver him from evil because he has persevered in faith.

In the gospel Jesus heals Peter's mother-in-law and all who come to him, the sick and the possessed (the spiritually troubled). He tells the apostles that there are other villages and places that are in need of him. Our faith tells us that when we trust in God, he will come to us to heal us, to give us strength to endure the trials of this world and deliver us from evil. St. Paul reminds us that living in faith will not always be easy; but if we sacrifice ourselves for the good of others, we too, will receive our heavenly inheritance.

The ultimate goal of our faith is to deepen our relationship with the Lord and to have the trust of Job, so that one day we might experience the intimate union of love that Jesus has with his Father. The gospel says that Jesus went to a deserted place to pray. It is only by taking time from our busy lives and making room for God in our hearts that we can attain that peace that only Christ can give.

DIVINE PROVIDENCE ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY DECEMBER 2023

With your support, we are able to continue serving those in need in our surrounding communities. Together we are impacting the lives of others by providing basic food, clothing, and toiletries they need for everyday living.

Westchester Food Pantry:

In December, we had the opportunity to participate at the Westchester Food Pantry by distributing toiletry items and cleaning products to their clients. We assembled in green, red, and gold metallic bags with 50 toiletry items of liquid Tide, Fabuloso multi-surface cleaner, dish soap, a kitchen scrubber, and a handi-wipe. 50 cleaning products of body wash, soap bar, shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste tubes, liquid hand soap, deodorant, a wash cloth, and a shower mesh pouf.







American Inn Motel: BEDS Plus provides temporary shelter in motels for individuals that are experiencing food insecurities. One location is the American Inn Motel located in La Grange Highlands, providing 450 individual meals a week to at-risk clients/families. We prepared and distributed 40 lunch bags. Each lunch bag included a sandwich, bag of chips, drink, banana, and a sweet treat. We also distributed to the clients 12 metallic fabric bags, one per family or one per single person. The bags were filled with a pen, pad of paper, two pairs of socks, one full size body wash and shampoo, mouthwash, deodorant, two tooth-brushes, toothpaste, plus a quart size Hefty bag filled with two or three Rice Krispies treats, three candy canes, 6 pkg. cookies or 6 pkg. cheese and crackers, pkg. of Teddy Grahams, and Ding Dongs.


2024 Annual Catholic Appeal Together at the Table

WORD OF THE WEEK

Evangelization \i-van-jə-lə-'zā-shən\

The act of preaching or proclaiming the gospel; how the Good News of Christ's coming is delivered to the ends of the earth. **Evangelizing** begins with the witness of an authentic Christian life. This witness involves humility, detachment from wealth, faith, hope, and charity. In this way one becomes a credible proclaimer of the joy found in Jesus.

An **evangelizer** must never look like someone who has just come back from a funeral!

The person who has been **evangelized** goes on to **evangelize** others. Here lies the test of truth, the touchstone of **evangelization**: it is unthinkable that a person should accept the Word and give himself to the kingdom without becoming a person who bears witness to it and proclaims it in his turn.

WHY IT MATTERS

Jesus is the first **evangelizer** when he proclaims the coming of God's reign. Delivering the Good News of what God has done for us is, in fact, the entire mission of the church.

All people have a right to receive the gospel, and all Christians have a duty to proclaim it. This is not an obligation, says Pope Francis in *Evangelii gaudium*, but a joy as we "point to a horizon of beauty" for all.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

What's the difference between catechesis and evangelization?

Catechesis is basically religious education. Rooted in the Greek word for "echo," its intent is to nurture the Christian life through imitation in word and deed. **Evangelization** also has Greek origins and means "proclaiming good news." That good news of God's reign is contained in the gospel. Just as catechesis doesn't mean memorizing rote facts about faith, **evangelization** isn't the same as shouting scripture verses to passersby. We can think of **evangelization** as creating the spark that ignites the fire, and catechesis as the work of tending the flame once it's established. . . . When the two work hand in hand, **evangelization** and catechesis can make us saints by bringing us to faith and then to holiness, inch by inch.


