

FROM THE PARISH OFFICE

My dear parishioners,

The Gospels tell us that Jesus went from place to place, preaching the Kingdom of God, healing the sick, and raising the dead. But before Jesus healed people physically, he healed them spiritually. In fact, his physical cures were signs of spiritual healing, the healing of the soul. In Matthew's Gospel, when Jesus healed a paralytic, his first words to him were not "Rise and walk", but rather, "Your sins are forgiven." Certainly, his words angered the Scribes and Pharisees, and why? Because "Only God can forgive sin," they said, 'not this itinerant preacher!'

But in Jesus, we meet the God who alone can forgive sins. His very Name, the Name of Jesus, means, "God saves!"

We hear in the Gospels, when he rose from the dead, the Risen Lord passed through doors that had been locked out of fear. He stood in the midst of his disciples, and said, "Peace be with you!" As he did so, he breathes the Holy Spirit upon them, thereby empowering them and their successors to forgive sin. "Whose sins you shall forgive, they are forgiven," he says to them – words that reverberate every time a priest in a confessional says, "I absolve you from your sins!"

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. How, then, shall we respond to God's mercy? And what does it mean truly to accept God's mercy into our hearts? To answer that question, let us look at what ordinary experience teaches us. Let us say you have hurt someone you really love, perhaps a spouse or a parent. Coldness of heart replaces the warmth of love. Tension enters into a tranquil relationship. Distance triumphs over intimacy. But suppose this loved one takes the initiative and reaches out to forgive you. Unless you are made of stone, you will be relieved, grateful, and joyful – because your loved one has given you a great gift, a gift of selfless love and mercy. Does that mean it is okay to go back to business as usual? Or does accepting another's forgiveness not mean that you and I have to change – not only our outward behavior but also what is in the depths of our hearts? Forgiveness is not a "get out of jail free" card! It is a new beginning!

Only a humble, contrite heart can receive the gift of mercy. When we truly take to heart the gift of Divine Mercy, it shatters our humanity! It shatters illusions we may have of self-sufficiency or superiority over others, illusions that our sins are someone else's fault, or really not too serious. When the light and love of the Risen Lord passes through our broken hearts, not only are our illusions dispelled but our humanity is restored from within. In that moment of grace, we can hear Jesus saying to us, "Peace be with you!" And once the peace of Christ enters our hearts, our lives change. We may stumble and fall, even repeatedly, but God's grace will be at work in us, patiently mending our hearts, replacing vice with virtue, making us luminous with love.

May God bless us and keep us always in his love!
Thank you Jesus for your Divine Mercy!

DESDE EL DESPACHO PARROQUIAL

Mis queridos feligreses,

Los Evangelios nos dicen que Jesús iba de un lugar a otro predicando el Reino de Dios, sanando a los enfermos y resucitando a los muertos. Pero, antes de que Jesús sanara a las personas físicamente, las sanaba espiritualmente. De hecho, sus curaciones físicas eran signos de curación espiritual, la curación del alma. En el Evangelio de Mateo, cuando Jesús sanó a un paralítico, sus primeras palabras no fueron "Levántate y anda", sino más bien: "Tus pecados te son perdonados". Ciertamente, sus palabras enfurecieron a los escribas y fariseos, ¿y por qué? Porque "solo Dios puede perdonar el pecado", ellos dijeron, "¡no este predicador itinerante!"

Pero en Jesús nos encontramos con el Dios que es el único que puede perdonar los pecados. Su mismo Nombre, el Nombre de Jesús, significa: "¡Dios salva!"

Escuchamos en los Evangelios que, cuando resucitó de entre los muertos, el Señor resucitado pasó por puertas que habían sido cerradas por miedo. Se puso en medio de sus discípulos y dijo: "¡La paz esté con vosotros!" Al hacerlo, sopla el Espíritu Santo sobre ellos, empoderándolos así a ellos y a sus sucesores para perdonar el pecado. "A quienes perdonéis los pecados, les serán perdonados", les dice palabras que resuenan, cada vez que un sacerdote en un confesionario dice: "¡Yo os absuelvo de vuestros pecados!"

Hoy es el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia. ¿Cómo, entonces, responderemos a la misericordia de Dios? ¿Y qué significa verdaderamente aceptar la misericordia de Dios en nuestros corazones? Para responder a esa pregunta, veamos lo que nos enseña la experiencia ordinaria. Digamos que has lastimado a alguien que realmente amas, tal vez un cónyuge o un padre. La frialdad del corazón reemplaza la calidez del amor. La tensión entra en una relación tranquila. La distancia triunfa sobre la intimidad. Pero supongamos que este ser querido toma la iniciativa y tiende a perdonarte. A menos que estés hecho de piedra, te sentirás aliviado, agradecido y alegre, porque tu ser querido te ha dado un gran regalo, un regalo de amor desinteresado y misericordioso. ¿Significa eso que está bien volver a lo de siempre? ¿O aceptar el perdón de otra persona no significa que tú y yo tenemos que cambiar, no solo nuestro comportamiento externo, sino también lo que está en lo más profundo de nuestros corazones? ¡El perdón no es una tarjeta para "salir de la cárcel gratis"! ¡Es un nuevo comienzo!

Sólo un corazón humilde y contrito puede recibir el don de la misericordia. Cuando realmente tomamos en serio el don de la Divina Misericordia, ¡destroza nuestra humanidad! Rompe las ilusiones que podamos tener de autosuficiencia o superioridad sobre los demás, las ilusiones de que nuestros pecados son culpa de otra persona, o que en realidad no son demasiado graves. Cuando la luz y el amor del Señor Resucitado pasan a través de nuestros corazones rotos, no solo se disipan nuestras ilusiones, sino que nuestra humanidad se restaura desde adentro. En ese momento de gracia, podemos escuchar a Jesús diciéndonos: "¡La paz esté con vosotros!" Y una vez que la paz de Cristo entra en nuestros corazones, nuestras vidas cambian. Podemos tropezar y caer, incluso repetidamente, pero la gracia de Dios estará obrando en nosotros, reparando pacientemente nuestros corazones, reemplazando el vicio por la virtud, haciéndonos luminosos con el amor. ¡Que Dios nos bendiga y nos guarde siempre en su amor!

DA MESA DO PÁROCO

Meus queridos paroquianos,
Os Evangelhos nos contam que Jesus ia de um lugar para outro, pregando o Reino de Deus, curando os enfermos e ressuscitando os mortos. Mas antes de Jesus curar as pessoas fisicamente, ele as curava espiritualmente. Na verdade, as suas curas físicas eram sinais da cura espiritual, a cura da alma. No Evangelho de Mateus, quando Jesus curou um paralítico, as suas primeiras palavras para ele não foram “Levanta-te e anda”, mas sim: “Os teus pecados estão perdoados”. Certamente suas palavras irritaram os escribas e fariseus, e por quê? Porque “Só Deus pode perdoar pecados”, disseram eles, ‘não este pregador itinerante!’

Mas em Jesus encontramos o Deus que é o único que pode perdoar pecados. Seu próprio Nome, o Nome de Jesus, significa “Deus salva”!

Ouvimos nos Evangelhos que, quando ressuscitou dos mortos, o Senhor Ressuscitado passou por portas que estavam trancadas por medo. Ele ficou no meio de seus discípulos e disse: “A paz esteja convosco!” Ao fazer isso, ele sopra o Espírito Santo sobre eles, capacitando-os e a seus sucessores a perdoar pecados. “Os pecados dos quais vocês perdoarão, eles serão perdoados”, diz ele – palavras que reverberam toda vez que o padre em um confessionário diz: “Eu os absolvoo de seus pecados!”

Hoje é Domingo da Divina Misericórdia. Como, então, Podemos responder à misericórdia de Deus? E o que significa verdadeiramente aceitar a misericórdia de Deus em nossos corações? Para responder a essas perguntas, vejamos o que a experiência comum nos ensina. Digamos que você magoou alguém que realmente ama, talvez um cônjuge ou um dos pais. A frieza do coração substitui o calor do amor, a tensão entra em um relacionamento tranquilo, a distância triunfa sobre a intimidade. Mas suponha que a outra pessoa tome a iniciativa e tente perdoá-lo. A menos que você seja feito de pedra, você ficará aliviado, grato e alegre – porque aquela pessoa lhe deu um grande presente, um presente de amor altruísta e misericordioso. Isso significa que não há problema em voltar a situação anterior? Ou aceitar o perdão de outra pessoa não significa que você e eu temos que mudar – não apenas o nosso comportamento exterior, mas também o que está nas profundezas dos nossos corações? O perdão não é um cartão para “sair da prisão”? É um novo começo!

Que Deus nos abençoe e nos mantenha sempre em seu amor! Obrigado Jesus pela Tua Divina Misericórdia!

INFORMACJE OD PROBOSZCZA

Drodzy Parafianie!

Ewangelie mówi nam, że Jezus wędrował z miejsca na miejsce, głosząc Królestwo Boże, uzdrawiając chorych i wskrzeszając zmarłych. Ale zanim Jezus uzdrowił kogoś fizycznie, uzdrawiał wcześniej duchowo. W rzeczywistości fizyczne uzdrawienie było znakiem uzdrawienia duchowego, uzdrawienia duszy. W Ewangelii wg św. Mateusza, gdy Jezus uzdrowił paralityka, najpierw powiedział: „Wstań i chodź”, a dopiero potem: „Twoje grzechy są odpuszczone”. Te słowa rozgniewały uczonych w Piśmie i faryzeuszy. Mówili oni: „Tylko Bóg może odpuszczać grzechy, a nie ten wędrowny kaznodzieja!”

Ale Jezus jest Bogiem, który może odpuszczać grzechy. Nawet Jego imię oznacza: „Bóg zbawia”!

Ewangelie mówi, że Zmartwychwstały Pan przechodził przez drzwi, które były zamknięte przez Apostołów ze strachu. Jednak On stanął pośród swoich uczniów i powiedział: „Pokój wam!” Następnie tchnął na nich Ducha Świętego, tym samym dając im i ich następcom moc odpuszczania grzechów. „Którym odpuścicie grzechy, są im odpuszczone” Do dziś te słowa rozbrzmiewają za każdym razem, gdy ksiądz w konfesjonale mówi: „Ja odpuszczam tobie grzechy!”

Dzisiaj Niedziela Miłosierdzia Bożego. Jaka powinna być nasza odpowiedź na Boże Miłosierdzie? Co oznacza prawdziwe przyjęcie Bożego Miłosierdzia do naszych serc? Aby odpowiedzieć na te pytania, popatrzmy na nasze codzienne doświadczenia. Założmy, że skrzywdziliśmy kogoś, kogo naprawdę kochamy, być może małżonka lub rodzica. Oziębłość serca zastąpiła ogień miłości, jakieś napięcie wkroczyło w spokojną relację, dystans zatriumfował nad intymnością. Ale przypuśćmy, że ta ukochana osoba podejmuje inicjatywę i wyciąga rękę, aby wybaczyć. Jeśli nie jesteśmy z kamienia, poczujuemy ulgę, wdzięczność i radość, ponieważ otrzymaliśmy wielki dar, dar bezinteresownej miłości i miłosierdzia. Czy to oznacza, że wszystko wróciło do normy?

Przyjęcie czegoś przebaczenia oznacza, że my sami musimy się zmienić. Nie tylko nasze zewnętrzne zachowanie, ale także to, co jest w głębi naszych serc. Przebaczenie nie jest zwolnieniem z aresztu! To nowy początek! Tylko pokorne, skruszone serce może otrzymać dar miłosierdzia. Kiedy naprawdę przyjmiemy do serca dar Bożego Miłosierdzia, wstrząśnie ono naszym człowieczeństwem! Rozbiję złudzenia, jakie możemy mieć co do naszej samowystarczalności lub wyższości nad innymi, złudzenia, że nasze grzechy są czystą winą lub że nie są zbyt ciężkie. Kiedy światło i miłość Zmartwychwstającego Pana przenikają nasze złamane serca, nie tylko nasze złudzenia zostają rozwiane, ale przede wszystkim zostaje nam przywrócone nasze człowieczeństwo. W tej chwili łaski możemy usłyszeć, jak Jezus mówi do nas: „Pokój wam!” A gdy pokój Chrystusa wypełnia nasze serca, nasze życie się zmienia.

Możemy się potykać i upadać, nawet wielokrotnie, ale łaska Boża będzie w nas działać, cierpliwie te serca naprawiając, zastępując wady cnotami i sprawiając, że będziemy jaśnić miłością.

Niech Bóg nas błogosławi i zawsze zachowuje nas w swojej miłości!





PROMISES OF JESUS TO THOSE WHO PRAY THE CHAPLET



In her Diary, St. Faustina recorded a number of conversations she had with Jesus during which He made promises to those devoted to His Divine Mercy. We selected a few of the most powerful of these promises with a special focus on praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.

PROMISES FOR PRAYING THE CHAPLET

"Oh, what great graces I will grant to souls who say this Chaplet. Write down these words, my daughter. Speak to the world about My mercy; let all mankind recognize my unfathomable mercy. It is a sign for the end times; after it will come the day of justice. While there is still time, let them have recourse to the fount of my mercy; let them profit from the blood and water which gushed forth for them." (Diary, 848)

"Say unceasingly the Chaplet that I have taught you. Whoever will recite it, they will receive great mercy at the hour of death. Priests will recommend it to sinners as their last hope of salvation. Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy." (Diary, 687)

THE PROMISE OF THE GRACE OF MERCY FOR THE DYING

"It pleases me to grant everything souls ask of me by saying the chaplet. When hardened sinners say it, I will fill their souls with peace, and the hour of their death will be a happy one. Write this for the benefit of distressed souls; when a soul sees and realizes the gravity of its sins, when the whole abyss of the misery into which it immersed itself is displayed before its eyes, let it not despair, but with trust, let it throw itself into the arms of My mercy, as a child into the arms of its beloved mother. Tell them no soul that has called upon My mercy has been disappointed or brought to shame. I delight particularly in a soul that has placed its trust in My goodness. Write that when they say this Chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My father and the dying person, not as the Just Judge but as the Merciful Savior." (Diary, 1541)

"At the hour of their death, I defend every soul that will say this Chaplet as I do my own glory. When this Chaplet is said by the bedside of a dying person, God's anger is placated and His unfathomable mercy envelops the soul." (Diary, 811)

"I desire that this mercy flow out upon the whole world through your heart. Let no one who approaches you go away without that trust in my mercy, which I so ardently desire for souls. Pray as much as you can for the dying. By your entreaties, obtain for them trust in my mercy, because they have most need of trust, and have it the least." (Diary, 1777)

EXAMPLE OF THE CHAPLET SAVING SOMEONE'S SOUL

"My daughter, help me to save a certain dying sinner. Say the Chaplet that I have taught you for him". When I began to say the Chaplet, I saw the man dying in the midst of terrible torment and struggle. His Guardian Angel was defending him, but he was, as it were, powerless against the enormity of the soul's misery. But while I was saying the Chaplet, I saw Jesus just as He is depicted in the Image. The rays that issued from Jesus' heart enveloped the sick man, and the powers of darkness fled in panic. The sick man peacefully breathed his last." (Diary, 1565)

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


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


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
