

DEAR PARISHIONERS OF ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA CHURCH & ANNUNCIATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY CHURCH,

Diocese of Lafayette Centennial Campaign

I am awed as we come to the conclusion of the Centennial Campaign. What a blessings we have in parishioners! Annunciation of the Blessed

Virgin Mary Parish raised in pledges \$95,285 which is 119% of the goal of \$80,000. St. Anthony of Padua raised in pledges \$836,690 which is 136% of the goal of \$615,000. These figures are as of February 24, 2016. According to that date, the overall success of the Centennial Campaign in the pilot phase is \$7,235,428 for a goal of 42.5 million dollars, which is 17% of goal. I appreciate everyone's good work at both Annunciation and St. Anthony.

Bishop Jarrell expresses his own appreciation and as you see in the bulletin we have an acknowledged appreciation from Mr. Shane Johnson, Director of the Office of Stewardship and Development.

I mentioned to Bishop Jarrell that we are indeed blessed with the mature spirituality of our parishioners. As we were going around asking parishioners to participate in the campaign, we discovered that many parishioners have several charities they support. Parishioners were already giving. When asked to take to prayer their participation, once again we see mature spirituality as many parishioners asked God in prayer about their participation. Indeed, our results are good. But the goodness in the hearts of you our parishioners make all this possible. Thank-you!!!

Remember Annunciation and St. Anthony were two of ten parishes in the pilot phase of the campaign. The other parishes in the Diocese are divided into three blocks. In March Block 1 begins the campaign. It takes 6 months to do the campaign. So for the next 18 months we will hear of the campaign for the other parishes. When we meet relatives and friends from these other parishes, let us encourage them and share our experience. Keep praying for the success of the campaign.

Bishop's Services Appeal

We now come to a turn around as we embrace the Bishop's Services Appeal for this year. Remember the Appeal was suspended until the conclusion of the Capital Campaign. Next weekend at both Annunciation and St. Anthony we welcome Bishop Jarrell's introduction to this year's Bishop's Services Appeal. Expect to receive

letters in regard to the Appeal this week. Let us all take a deep breath, ask God to clear our minds, and be open to the Appeal.

Gospel for the Fourth Sunday of Lent, Cycle C – Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

Jesus crossed lines that were not supposed to be crossed. Jesus talked to women in public, touched the "unclean" to heal them, and befriended tax collectors and sinners. This did not make sense. It did not fit into the standard categories. So the religious leaders began to complain. In response, Jesus told the parable of the prodigal son. Through this story, Jesus illustrated that God loves all of his children even when they have not behaved perfectly. But more that this, the tale also deals with the resentment of the older son. Like the self-righteous Pharisees and scribes, the older brother complained. But how does the father respond? "My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours."

It is important for those of us who attend Mass regularly, participate in the sacraments, and serve in our parishes not to fall into the trap of being like the bitter older brother or the complaining Pharisees. It can be easy to think that others do not deserve as much as we do, and to forget to be grateful for all that we have. But we are all called to "celebrate and rejoice" when the lost return home.
