



be scheduled. So I have decided to have this collection next weekend at both Annunciation and St. Anthony Churches. At St. Anthony we ordinarily have the monthly Parish Maintenance & Insurance Fund Collection. So next weekend, I ask that those with envelopes place their collection for the Parish Maintenance & Insurance Fund Collection in the first collection. Then at both Annunciation and St. Anthony the *second collection* will be for the victims of the Flooding of 2016. Thank you for your generosity!

School Thoughts

Wow! It looks like we might have school on a regular basis now that the flooding has gone down. So if I may, I would like to share some thoughts:

Education prepares us for a productive adult life where we not only provide a livelihood for our family and ourselves, but also provide positive contribution to the common good. Our contribution to the common good occurs with our involvement and engagement in society. For us to do this we need more than a development of academic skills. We need social skills. We need team skills. We need personal skills. We need a vision of humanity and desire to make a contribution toward this vision. So when we speak of education preparing us for adult life, we are really talking about the quality of our person where our personality and skills come together.

What may be some of these qualities? Our ability to engage with others, our vision of life, and our functional skills (to name a few) are some of these qualities. Let me write on each one.

Our ability to engage with others is how we can be acquainted and friends with each other. It is how we can empathize and be compassionate for each other. It begins with how we know ourselves and how we react with others. In some ways this starts within our family life, where we learn to live with each other in a loving and caring way. We talk, we think, we discuss in our own family. We test ourselves and grow in our attempts to engage with our family and then with those outside of our family. This is why the social science people tell us that for family life to do what it is suppose to do, a family needs to eat together at least five times a week. They tell us that the time it takes for a family to gather at a meal and talk about things and be with each other sets the climate for engagement to grow.

Our vision of life happens when we gather for church. It is here that we see how God loves us and how God calls all humanity to a relationship with Him where we have a purpose. We are called to God's vision of humanity. We learn from God how to have a relationship with Him and each other. Our life on earth prepares us for our life in Heaven. This vision of life moves us to work for the common good and pulls from our habits the virtues and sacrifices to make a positive contribution to this view of life.

Our functional skills are reading, writing, and arithmetic. Here school is the primary place this is developed, although home life and community life encourage and reinforce their development. We all know that when our children prepare for Head Start and Kindergarten there are basic skills they need to know before they arrive. As first grade, second grade, and third grade come, these skills build on each other. As our children continue to advance towards the sixth, seventh, and eighth grades, family and community act as coaches for practice of the skills. For example, by the time one is in the eighth grade: one should be reading 24 books a year, one should be taking algebra and be ready to take high school algebra upon leaving the eighth grade, and one should be able to write, and write, and write.

Today, in our times of television, Internet, computer games, smartphones, texting many of these skills (engagement with others, vision of life, functional skills) become dysfunctional. If they do not develop, as they should, one's ability to be successful in adult life may be impeded.

So I think that here is where everyone in society can help with creating a climate for growth and personal improvement. We can encourage a discipline for study and for building reading, thinking, and writing skills. We can encourage human interaction. We can be positive about our view of life we get from God and church. We can assist parents in creating a wider reference where everyone is interested in the student's reading, thinking, and writing skills. With the parents, we can ask, "What book are you reading?" "Tell me about the story or plot in the book you have just read." "Do you write any letters to your friends or do you just e-mail them?" If we find a child does not read books, then we can discover their interests and point to books where they may find their interest is the subject matter. By helping the child explore in this way, we may be watering their growth in reading.

Now let us remember the bigger view: engagement with others, vision of life, functional skills come together in a person over-time. Parents, teachers, and all of us – the whole

community - coach our children in life. As school restarts, let us all restart our excitement about life and our contribution to a greater good in society.

Gospel for the Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, Cycle C - Luke 14:1, 7-14

Today Jesus instructs us to be generous enough to serve others without expecting repayment. At least, without expecting to be repaid in this life. It is interesting that the Gospel concludes with Jesus' promise that if we follow this teaching, we "will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous." In other words, God will "repay" our generosity on earth by welcoming us into heaven. In essence, Jesus tells us to use our money for the sake of others, not just to assure our own earthly comfort. Instead of investing everything in a bank, Jesus asks us to invest in the poor. After all, no bank on earth can possibly provide the infinite rate of return that Jesus promises. Really, what better investment could there possibly be?
