





Week of Prayer for Christian Unity January 18 – 25, 2017

This year's theme as jointly prepared and published by the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity and the Commission on Faith and Order of the World Council of

Churches is **Reconciliation** – **The Love of Christ comples Us** (cf. 2 Cornthians 5:14-20). Please find with this bulletin a theme for each day with prayer and Bible references to select for reflection.

This year the Eunice Area Prayer Service is held at Eunice High School Auditorium on Wednesday, January 18, 2017 at 6:00 p.m. I invite all parishioners to join the Eunice Christian Community in prayer. I was asked to be the speaker. So I appreciate parishioner's presence. We need your presence as together we join others in witnessing Jesus Christ to the Eunice Community.

To introduce the week, the three Catholic Pastors of Eunice are rotating churches this way: *Father Clinton Sensat* is at St. Mathilda (Eunice) and Our Lady of Mt. Carmel (Chataignier), *Father Darren Eldridge* is at St. Anthony of Padua (Eunice), and *Msgr. Robert Romero* is at St. Thomas More (Eunice). We are doing this pulpit and altar exchange only on Sunday masses not anticipating mass on Saturday.

We pray Catholics will join the joint prayer service at Eunice High School Auditorium and will welcome the witness of Catholic unity with area Catholic Pastors exchanging pulpit and altar. Thank You!

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question: Why do we baptize infants when the Bible says "repent and be baptized"? How can an infant repent?

Answer: When you take a trip, you do not wait until you run out of gas before you fill the tank — at least not on purpose! You fill your tank and pack your bags as you anticipate a trouble-free journey. We can make a similar case for the baptism of children as they begin their spiritual journey. In the early church, only adults were baptized when they professed faith in Jesus as the Messiah. As the church grew, children were baptized and raised in faith. The Bible does not limit baptism to adults. Several passages point to infant baptism. Jesus said, "Let the children come to me and do not hinder them," while Paul would baptize people "and their household." He did not limit baptism to adults. Ultimately, our whole life is an act of repentance, a continual struggle to turn from sin and be faithful to the Gospel. We believe that baptism is more than a symbolic act of faith. It forgives original sin as well as personal sin, and brings us into the church, where we begin our journey of faith.

Confirmation Retreat

Next weekend candidates for confirmation at both Annunciation Church and St. Anthony Church will be on retreat. They will attend the 11:00 a.m. mass as their return mass. Please pray for them as they prepare to complete their Christian Initiation.

Gospel for Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, Cycle A – John 1:29-34

John the Baptist had an important message to impart. He was called by God to prepare the people of Israel to recognize Jesus' true identity. In a sense, he helped establish credibility for Christ by confirming that he was in fact the Messiah. Jesus did not just have to claim it on his own; John also "testified" to the fact. We, of course, also benefit from the witness of John the Baptist recorded for us in the Gospels. And we have additional witnesses from the rest of the people throughout the Gospels who knew and recognized Jesus as the Son of God. But we also have the benefit of two thousand years of Church history! We have countless testimonies of saints and believers throughout the centuries who have known Jesus in their own lives and acted accordingly.

This raises two questions. First, are we willing to believe these testimonies from those who have gone before us? Consider how much credence we give to the experiences and the stories of our forefathers and foremothers in the faith — whether they are blood relatives or members of the larger communion of saints. Sometimes these personal accounts of coming to know the Lord are much more powerful than any "proof" or intellectual proposal about Christianity. They do require a degree of faith and trust, but they nonetheless provide us with real evidence about the impact of being close to Christ.

Secondly, let us consider whether or not we are willing to give testimony to who Christ is to us? It is one thing to believe in Jesus; it is another thing to share that faith with others. But like John the Baptist, we are called to share the truth so that others may come to believe.

Questions for the Week

John 1:29-34 - Only in the Gospel of John do we hear the title "the Lamb of God" used in reference to Jesus. What does this title mean to you?

Isaiah 49:3, 5-6 - According to the prophet Isaiah, what motivated God to call Isaiah to be his "servant"?

1 Corinthians 1:1-3 - In his opening words to the Corinthian Christians, how does Paul promote unity of all the faithful?

Opening Prayer [Each Day] Almighty God, you sent your Son Jesus Christ to reconcile the world to yourself. We praise you for those whom you sent in the power of the Spirit to preach the Gospel to all nations. We thank you that in all parts of the earth a community of love has been gathered together by their prayers and labors, and that in every place your servants call upon your name. May your Spirit awaken in every community a hunger and thirst for unity in you. Amen.

Day 1 - One has died for all (2 Corinthians 5:14)

Isaiah 53:4-12 - He gave his life as an atoning sacrifice; Psalm 118: 1,14-29 - God did not abandon me to death; 1 John 2:1-2 - Christ died for all; John 15:13-17 - Giving his life for his friends
