



Christ. The Appeal this year coincides with the 100th Anniversary of the Diocese of Lafayette. The theme for the Appeal is "Century of Love". Next Sunday at both Annunciation and St. Anthony we will continue the Appeal with the "IN-PEW COMMITMENT WEEKEND".

THE 2018 THEME - "Century of Love"

This theme reflects upon several qualities of our faith and history. We reflect upon the great teaching of Christ: "Love One Another as I have Loved You." Reflect on this truth that through all the good or tough times of our existence as a diocese, we have first always been loved by God. God's love has brought us into existence and has always seen us as special to His heart. We are not a random group of people placed together but as Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI once explained, we are each exact thoughts in the mind of God. And so it is God's love that places each of us into the right generation and time and place for the great salvific purpose of the world. The Diocese of Lafayette has been formed as an expression of God's Love.

This Love has also been given with a Mission. Love is something that must be given and not just received. As God has chosen and loved us into being this good and devout diocese, it is for the purpose of loving the world and each other, guided by truths and strengths of our faith. We are called to help each other grow in holiness, and each of us has been given the strength needed to fulfill our call from God. Each of us has received a call from God, and it is our duty and our salvation to live it out in love.

This century of our diocesan history has begun because of God's love and has been directed by God's Love and we are strengthened into love of God and Neighbor by God's love. "It is by our love that they shall know we are Christian." Millions have walked the land of this Diocese and lived their faith and each of us is a significant part of the activity of what happens to and with the True Faith.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question: What is holy water and how do I explain the reason that it is placed at the entrances of churches to my non-Catholic friends?

Answer: Holy water is a sacramental; a reminder of the life of the Church expressed and celebrated through the sacraments. By blessing ourselves with holy water as we enter the church, we are reminded of our own baptism and our call to conversion. Remember, the Church is sacramental. God's grace is mediated through word and gesture (the outward signs). This comes to us through Jesus (instituted by Christ) as he entrusts to the Church his

saving mission (to give grace). In turn, the Church shares that grace and mission with us.

We especially use holy water during Easter when the priest sprinkles the people. It serves to remind us that we are indeed on a journey of faith that makes us one with Christ. Blessing ourselves not only reminds us that we are baptized into a community of faith, but also helps us renew our own baptismal promises to reject sin and to believe in God. It is the heart of Christian belief to turn from sin and toward God. Holy water and baptism make it a visible sign for all of us to follow.

Gospel for the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A – Mk. 1:29-39

For most of us, the dynamic between prayer and action is imperfect. Breakfast needs to be made and the kids dressed. Work demands our energy and additional responsibilities fill our evenings and weekends. Then there's the football game or a new TV series to stream. After all, don't we need to relax?

We're all busy. But just imagine Jesus' situation in today's Gospel. He heals Peter's mother-in-law, drives out demons, and cures diseases late into the night. With very little sleep, he arises before dawn to capture some peace and quiet, only to find "those who were with him pursued him." How often do we feel pursued by harried commitments, even when we try to seek rest? Perhaps we can learn something from the response of Jesus.

Jesus models two key things: the essential nature of prayer and the essential call of vocation. "He went off to a deserted place, where he prayed." Despite inevitable exhaustion, Jesus prioritizes time with the Father. We might not have easy access to deserts and mountaintops, but today's Gospel challenges us to take intentional time set apart for God. We can designate a "prayer chair" in a corner of our home or leave a little earlier to pick our children up from school so we can snatch time in a nearby chapel. We can pray the rosary on our commute or take the dog for a long walk in silence.

However, when the Apostles arrive, Jesus doesn't linger overlong in the deserted place or make an excuse for why he can't return with his friends. Jesus is true to his calling. He continues on in his state of life, serving the people nearest to him. Like Jesus, we are invited to set intentional time for communion with God so that we can be refreshed and empowered for our communion with others.

Questions for the Week

First Reading – Job 7:1-4, 6-7 - Job struggles with anxious and hopeless feelings. As people of faith, how can we best help family or friends who really believe, "I shall not see happiness again?"

Second Reading – 1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23 - Paul speaks to the Corinthians of his "obligation" to preach the Gospel – the good news of Jesus Christ. What actions does your faith in Christ compel you to do?

Gospel Reading – Mark 1:29-39 - Mark presents Jesus as a miracle-worker from the earliest stages of his public ministry. In what ways do you think it was a challenge to balance the healing and the preaching?
