## Mass Count

Bishop Deshotel, in a letter dated April 12, 2018 has asked that all churches and missions in the Diocese of Lafayette take a mass count of attendances at masses for the weekends of May and October. He says, "... it [mass count] involves long range pastoral planning for the Diocese of Lafayette and data necessary for the new evangelization." He continues, "I have decided to establish a new policy and procedure for tracking Mass attendance in all Parishes and Parish Missions. Every May and October, beginning in 2018, our Jubilee Centennial Year, I am requiring a mass attendance count for all weekend obligation Masses, Saturday Vigil and Sunday Masses in May and October." He also tells pastors, ".. this will give you useful statistics for understanding trends and keeping/adjusting weekend Mass schedules." So next weekend at both Annunciation and St. Anthony, I ask the ushers to begin the mass count. To ensure we have constant numbers, we will do it during the first reading at mass. As the ushers are moving up and down the aisles of church, I pray we are not too distracted from hearing God's Word proclaimed.

## WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question: My best friend is Lutheran and is a good Christian. I would like her to be my child's sponsor, but I'm wondering, does she have to be a practicing Catholic?

Answer: The practice of two godparents for an infant's baptism goes back to the time when church law and civil law were one and the same in Europe. If anything did happen to the parents, the custody and well-being of the child became the responsibility of the godparents.

For Adult baptism, it is required that one have a sponsor from the church who would act as a guide or mentor, in bringing the person to faith.

Today, being a godparent has no legal implications according to civil law. It is a spiritual matter. We need at least one godparent who must be a practicing Catholic. A non-Catholic Christian is not a godparent but can be a Christian witness. This distinction recognizes the difference between faith and religion. A Christian can be a witness because of his or her relationship to God (faith), but the Catholic is a mentor in the practice of the religion.

In any event, it is vital that parents give serious consideration to the people they choose to be a child's godparent. That choice should be based on practice of faith, solid moral character, and ability to give good example. Too often the choice is left to whose turn it is in the family, or to friends that parents wish to honor or acknowledge in some way. The choice of godparents is the first lesson of faith a parent teaches their child. Make it count!

## Gospel of Fifth Sunday of Easter, Year B - John 15:1-8

Are you ready for a trim? In today's Gospel, we hear the familiar teaching of the vine and the branches. Jesus reminds us that if we remain close to him-living in humility, following God's law, loving our neighborwe will notice a positive change in our life and the lives of those around us. "Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit." The Holy Spirit is life-giving. He is fruitful. The Spirit of God won't refuse grace to a heart that is open.

As we progress through life, learning how to live and love, we grow. Our personalities flower. We discover what it is to be a blessing to others. We also experience lack, loss, and the results of our failures. We know what it is like to "wither" at times, particularly the times when we willingly separate ourselves from Jesus. "Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me." For most of us, this experience of being disconnected and off track generates a desire to return to what is right and good, to return to the vine.

But this Gospel is more than "Are you in or are you out?" Even when we remain in God, when we follow Jesus, we are not exempt from the challenge, the pruning. "Everyone that [bears fruit] he prunes." A prudent trim is necessary in the natural world of trees and vines. Dead wood, broken shoots, and diseased branches need to be cut back in order for the plant to bear fruit. Jesus wants us to be healthy! He says as much himself: "By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples." Take a look at your life today. Where are you bearing fruit? Where do you need to be pruned?

First Reading - Acts 9:26-31 - Today's reading records the initial reaction of the Disciples to Paul's conversion. What do you think would have been the Disciples' main concern?
Second Reading - 1 John 3:18-24 - John challenges his community to love one another in both word and deed. What obstacles stand in the way of this charge?
Gospel Reading - John 15:1-8 - What do you think Jesus means when he says believers are "pruned" by God in order to bear more fruit?
