

From our Associate Pastor: UNPOPULAR OPINION: We will suffer and it's GOOD

St. Peter says it best in the scriptures: "Even if you suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated." 1 Peter 3:14.

Now I know what you are all probably thinking. "Fr. Hebert wrote in his last article about the things he learned since he had his accident. Now he's talking again about suffering, what's with this guy?" It's true, but, I promise not every entry will be about suffering. As a matter of fact, my end goal is to bring light in darkness. And that's what this whole entry is actually about. Suffering isn't all that dark, as a matter of fact, one small candle is seen in the darkest of rooms. That small light overcomes any darkness.

There's a trend it seems every week in the social media world that tends to pop up and be the new thing. Lately, I've been using Twitter (I know, Lord help me!) more than any other social media platform, and the current trend on Twitter is the hashtag #UnpopularOpinion. Most of the stuff people put on that hashtag are silly things to make people laugh, but I'm actually going to give the unpopular opinion today that is factual: we will suffer and it's GOOD. Now, before I continue, I do realize that many people suffer horrible things in life. The loss of a family member, severe injuries, or even people who have emotionally hurt you. Let me set the record strait here: we as Catholic are not masochists, we do not promote the idea of seeking these terrible forms of suffering just because we want to. Simply, my argument here is that we ought to change the way that we think about suffering when it comes into our lives unintentionally.

I like to think of suffering in the way that Navy SEALs and other special forces tasks tend to think about suffering. I like to follow a lot of these types of guys because they seem to have a way of overcoming anything that they confront. It's inspiring. One of the guys I like the most is this American Hero named "Jocko Willink." Yes, his first name is in fact "Jocko," and it's awesome. He looks exactly like he sounds, gigantic, strong, and a face that would make any enemy run away from him. He posted a video several years ago called "GOOD," which I found to be quite Catholic in ideology. Even though he wasn't posting it as a Catholic inspirational video, his message was simple and profound. His point was that when something bad comes into our life, we can shrink from it and let it control us into frustration, anger, and resentment. Or, we can look at it as an opportunity to get better. Point being, the struggle makes you better. SEALs and special forces guys aren't unfamiliar with struggle. Many of them have to go through their training several times because of minor or major injuries. They go through the most rigorous training, both physically, mentally, and emotionally. Their minds are calloused. We're all thankful for the sacrifice they give to us. (I'll post the link to his video at the end).

Well, to be quite honest, as a priest, and most importantly as a Catholic, we are like the special forces of Christianity. We take no shortcuts, we never preach a prosperity gospel, and we take the exact spiritual life as taught by Christ. That is, IF WE ARE BRAVE ENOUGH TO ACCEPT IT! One of those difficult teachings is what Peter tells us in 1 Peter 3:14. Expect the suffering to come, but don't run from it. See it as an opportunity to strengthen your soul. We are unique as Catholics in this regard. Today, you can comfort yourself with spiritual "experts," like Joel Osteen and other prosperity gospel preachers, who really aren't experts and just want to make you feel good so they can get rich off of you. (Caveat: not all christian religions are as soft as prosperity gospel preachers). But, my main point is that we as Catholics say NO. We understand one thing that's for SURE, there is NO RESURRECTION SUNDAY WITHOUT A GOOD FRIDAY. What I mean by that, is there can be no glory without the cross. Christ didn't run from it, and we follow in his footsteps. He suffered before he resurrected.

Is this masochistic? No. It's not masochistic because we don't have to willingly seek suffering to fulfill our obligation to follow in Christ's footsteps. We know it will come in some form in our life without our pursuit of it. The key to seeing our suffering as something we can handle is the way that we look at it. We can become resentful and hateful towards God because he allowed it to happen to us, or we can see it as something GOOD because through it we can become more dependent on God. It's really that simple. Don't be afraid. Allow the suffering to help you grow and become a saint!

I'd like to leave you with a beautiful mediation that I read about suffering in a blog by Dan Burke. He writes the following: "If I had not been in pain, He has not relieved me. If I have not been sad, He has not lifted my heart to heaven. If I have not been reviled, He has not comforted me. If I have not been abandoned, He has not come to me. If I have been broken, He has not healed me. If I have not been lost, He has not shown me the way. If I have not been in sin, He has not redeemed me. If I have not been without a friend, He has not walked beside me. If I have not mourned, He has not comforted me. If I have not been betrayed, He has not restored me. If I have not been in chains, He has not set me free. If I have not wept, He has not dried my tears. If I have not been in the depths of darkness, He has not brought me into the light. If I have not suffered, I HAVE NOT KNOWN HIM.'




NEW SERVERS' SCHEDULE

Call by September 23rd to get your changes into the new schedule.


