#### The Birth of the Church

Before Jesus' Ascension, He told the disciples to wait in Jerusalem until the Holy Spirit would come. Jesus commanded the disciples to "not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift My Father promised, which you have heard Me speak about. For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit" (Acts 1:4-5). The Church could not exist without the Holy Spirit and so on the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit was given to the Church and the Church was born.



# PASTOR'S CORNER



Dear Our Lady's Families and Visitors,

#### **PENTECOST: THE INNER LIFE OF THE CHURCH**

Last weekend, Holy Mother Church celebrated the great 'completion' of Jesus' earthly mission and His glorious and magnificent **Ascension** to His Heaven Father. This weekend the Church celebrates Jesus' sending and empowering His Church through the Holy Spirit: **Pentecost**.

We know that Jesus had commissioned His apostles to introduce the Kingdom of God to nations everywhere by bringing them to Him. To do this, He said that they would receive power from on high. This they did. A few days later it came about: "Suddenly, from up in the sky, there came a noise like a strong, driving wind... And tongues, as of fire, descended upon each of the disciples and all were filled with the Holy Spirit ... and made bold proclamation as the Spirit prompted them." (Acts 2:2-4). The Church was born and now we are to help bring souls to Christ.

Here is an analogy about what the Holy Spirit can do in a person who is open to Him. By itself, grape juice has an enjoyable and refreshing sweetness. But a deeper and more 'intrinsic,' change happens during a 'fermentation' process. What once had a simple sweetness, now has a delightful fragrance and a magnificent richness, also an alcohol characteristic.

I think we've experienced how wine can make the 'timid' heart, brave, a timid person suddenly amorous, and all because of fermentation. As simple fermentation can change ordinary grape juice into a deliciously and intoxicating wine, so can the Holy Spirit cause us to fall in love with God, become true temples and disciples of the Holy Spirit, and can lead and bring souls to Christ.

We know we're not perfect. In fact the Church is made up of simple, imperfect people like you and me; otherwise there would be no need for Sacraments or a Savior. But we need the Lord. The good thing is that each one of us is capable of being changed by the Holy Spirit and letting the life of Christ Jesus live through us in our families and the world. The more regularly we pray and reverently participate in His Holy Mass, the more His Spirit will fill our soul and the world.

Today, let us pray for the Holy Spirit to come once again, into our hearts, our families, our parishes and the world. "Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Thy faithful, and enkindle in them the fire of Thy love. Send forth Thy Spirit, and they shall be created, and Thou shalt renew the face of the earth. Amen."

#### RESPECT LIFE ARTICLE

#### **Reason for Optimism for LIFE**

Following South Dakota's enactment of the most pro-life law in America, Roe v. Wade may well be revisited in the not too distant future. As a result, USA Today recently published an article (based largely on data from the pro-abortion group, the Alan Guttmacher Institute) which predicts what would be likely to happen if Roe v. Wade were overturned and abortion became a state-by-state issue again.

The results are quite surprising and positive for LIFE. Only 16 states are likely to continue abortion on demand---any time, any place, for any reason---if Roe v Wade were overturned. This would include seven states on the West Coast and almost every state in the Northeast, but only a third of the U.S population.

By contrast, at least 22 states containing half of all Americans would almost definitely enact either complete or near-complete abortion bans. recognizing that the unborn child is a person, deserving of basic human rights like the rest of


This is very encouraging and underlines the importance of using our influence to enact laws like the Unborn Child Amendment in South Dakota.


