



Coming To Know God

The person of faith seeks God and discovers certain ways of coming to know Him because we are “created in God’s image and called to know and love Him” (CCC, II 31). Just like in any relationship in our lives, the seeking produces communion and relationship, which is our proof of His existence and our certainty about the truth.

“When you call me, when you go to pray to me, I will listen to you. When you look for me, you will find me. Yes, when you seek me with all your heart, you will find me with you, says the Lord.”
~ Jeremiah 29:12;14a

We have an open invitation to approach God in prayer because of what our Lord Jesus did for us on the cross. This is how we build relationship with our Heavenly Father.

“So let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help.”
~ Hebrews 4:16

“With his openness to truth and beauty, his sense of moral goodness, his freedom and the voice of his conscience, with his longings for the infinite and for happiness, man questions himself about God’s existence. In all this he discerns signs of his spiritual soul. The soul, the “seed of eternity we bear in ourselves, irreducible to the merely material,” can have its origin only in God” (CCC, 33).

What does all this mean as we seek to come to know God?
It means that we are free to approach His throne because of Jesus Christ.
It means that we can confidently answer the challenge posed by St. Augustine:

“Question the beauty of the earth, question the beauty of the sea, question the beauty of the air distending and diffusing itself, question the beauty of the sky...question all these realities. All respond: “See, we are beautiful.” Their beauty is a profession. These beauties are subject to change. Who made them if not the Beautiful One who is not subject to change?”

We can see and feel God all around us. Here in our beautiful mountain town it is easy to find moments of God’s beauty in our daily lives. Let us not take for granted the blessing it is to be alive in this moment. May we remember God and thank Him for His blessings throughout each moment of each day. May we remember our loved ones, those who have gone before us, as we continue to live in remembrance and honor of them and our Lord.
