The proceeds of this concert went towards the cost of replacing the parish The total collections for the event were \$2,028.00 which was comprised of \$1,834.00 in free will contributions at the door, as well as \$110.00 in CD sales. As well, \$84.00 in refreshments were graciously donated back to the church by the NCCB and the CWL respectively.
