LITURGY CORNER

Lent: We are now in the season of Lent. Lent really has a two-fold purpose: to ask each one of us to consider our baptismal responsibility as we prepare to celebrate the great feast of Easter, and to provide the immediate preparation for those who will be initiated into the Christian family at the Easter Vigil. Three time-honoured practices help us with this Lenten preparation: prayer (maybe more personal prayer time or attending daily Mass); fasting (from bad habits, from unkind words or actions or from particular foods or drink); and alms-giving (think Development and Peace collections or donations to charities etc.). During Sunday Mass throughout Lent, neither the Gloria nor the Alleluia are sung and the colour is a somber purple.
