

Message from St. Basil's CWL Women in the Church Committee: On January 11, 2021, Pope Francis announced a formal change to women's role in the church. Many Catholics were thrilled at what they perceived as a long-awaited necessary recognition of the reality of parish life. A short history of how this has played out at St. Basil's follows the article below from the National Catholic Reporter.

The History of the role of women at St. Basil's What was a surprise to many parishioners at St. Basil's was that these newly approved roles for women was even a topic of concern in 2021.

When the parish (then known as St. Andrew's) was first established in February, 1957 the first altar servers were all boys because that is the way it was done that long ago. The importance of this role for boys was recognized by the annual ceremony of investiture for the Knights of the Altar. In 1960 alone, close to 50 young boys were invested by Father Silvester, parish priest, and received their cassock and surplice. It was hoped that some of them would go on to become ordained priests. However, the 1960s was a decade of huge change in the church. By the mid 1970s, the term "altar boys" had long been quietly changed to "altar servers" as both boys and girls were serving at Mass. So, there is a half century of history that girls and boys could be equals as servers at St. Basil's.

Another drastic change from the norm in the early days of the parish was the introduction of lay lectors by Father Ruth. In 1959, the first lay lectors were men (Gord Atkinson, Bernard Daly and Jack Kinsella – all used to being on the radio). Within a year or so, they would be joined by the first woman, Marion Dewar. About 1970, Father Silvester encouraged more women to join and one of the first to respond was teenager, Els Hilkes. By that time, it was normal that both men and women were lectors and there was a great push to bring in more young people, also seen as a radical change. So, there is a history of nearly 60 years in this parish of having people of all ages serve as lectors.

In 1979, Father Ruth introduced another change that was at first seen as radical. In response to the declining number of available priests, he asked married couples to serve as extraordinary Ministers of Communion. When it became difficult to find enough married couples to volunteer for duty, the

criteria changed again. Within a few years, the call for volunteers went out to anyone 16 years of age and older. Very soon the majority of Eucharistic ministers were women. So, there is a history of about 40 years of men and women serving Communion at St. Basil's.

Why It Matters

Pope Francis' Apostolic letter, Spiritus Domini, expands Canon Law 230 to include all lay people. While this change was made at St. Basil's many decades ago, it has yet to be made universal. Even in North America, there are still dioceses where women and girls are not allowed visible roles at Mass.

Pope Francis has the authority to change church teaching in order to reflect the signs of the times and to make the Church more inclusive. He has changed just one word in the Canon Law on the issue. He has made laymen into laypersons. In doing so, the Pope is confirming in law that women are equal to men in the eyes of God – the first time that the Church has done so. This is a big step forward.

That is why this announcement matters.
