



Father Corbin Eddy – for further reflection:

The Road to Character, to which I referred last Sunday,



is the fourth book written by journalist David Brooks. Alongside writing a regular column in the New York Times and appearing weekly on National Public Radio and Television, he taught an undergraduate course at Yale University for three years during the 2010s on humility, the subject of this book. Published in 2015, the author says, "I wrote it, to be honest, to save my own soul." Responding to what he calls the culture of the Big

Me, David Brooks challenges us, and himself, to rebalance the scales between our "résumé virtues" — achieving wealth, fame, and status; and our "eulogy virtues" — kindness, bravery, honesty, and faithfulness. Blending psychology, politics, spirituality, and the confessional, Brooks provides his readers with an opportunity to rethink priorities and strive to build rich inner lives marked by humility and moral depth.

I recommend it highly as Lenten reading, especially alongside the parish's *Blessed of our Times* series. Both center on the personal and spiritual lives of real people with whom we can identify on our own "road." You may also like to google him to watch short you tube talks about this book as well as an interview with Oprah Winfrey. If you google David Brooks at Washington National Cathedral, you will discover two remarkable sermons that he delivered there.

You will also be directed to **LOVE THY NEIGHBOR**, his contribution to the cathedral's HONEST TO GOD series. As founder of Weave: The Social Fabric Project, he teams with Dr. Catherine Meeks, Executive Director of the Absalom Jones Center for Racial Healing, to take a deep dive into the importance of local relationships amid global challenges. Dean Randy Hollerith of the cathedral invites both of them to share their experiences of local engagement and to explore how healing in local communities contributes to healing the soul of the nation. This too would be of special interest here at St. Basil's in partnership with Kateri Ministries.

His more recent work *The Second Mountain* builds on *The Road to Character* and is particularly challenging for those of us who have reached a "certain age."
