## 2022 Charitable Disbursements

Each year the Committee chooses recipients for its share of the parish's charitable donations budget. The 2022 recipients are listed below. They are categorized according to the MSJC priorities: Indigenous Reconciliation, Care for Creation, Homelessness, Housing and Poverty, Seniors and Health, and International and Refugees. Of a total \$8,600, \$200 went to membership fees for the Green Churches Network and Multifaith Housing and the remainder was divided equally (\$700) among the other twelve recipients.
