OUR 2017 MISSION COOPERATIVE APPEAL

The Propagation of the Faith office of our Rockford diocese has invited the diocese of KUMBAKONAM, India to speak to us about their missionary activities and challenges. Accordingly, Rev. M. S. Selva Raj will be speaking to us during all the Masses on the weekend of Sept 30/Oct 01. This diocese has an area of 7823 sq km and is situated in Tamil Nadu, South India with a Catholic population of 213,000 which is just 6% of the total population. It is served by 200 diocesan and 73 religious priests, 568 nuns and 15 trained lay catechists. The Kumbakonam diocese celebrated the centenary of its inception in 1999 by setting certain concrete and meaningful goals for a New Evangelization in the III millennium, like:

- Establishing 12 more new parishes, each with a new church and rectory. At present, there are 93 parishes and 621 missions-stations. Many of these are so large that they have to be made independent parishes with a resident priest. But the people are quite unable to support the church, for such pressing pastoral projects. We have enough priests to staff more parishes.
- 2. Providing all the 126 Catholic schools in remote missions with better facilities tools, Children's Bibles, a projector, catechetical materials in the form of DVDs, pictures, books and workbooks to improve the quality of religious and faith formation of Catholic and non-Catholic students in our schools.
- 3. Since education is a main means of evangelizations here, the diocese has to provide buildings and infra-structure to our schools in remote villages while the government would pay most of our teachers.
- 4. Education of 2000 very poor or orphan children from remote villages every year by providing them with free board & lodge. All the above mission projects are 80% dependent on MCP funds each year.

The mission and spiritual prospects of Kumbakonam diocese are bright but its needs are many and pressing. 60% of its Catholics are depressingly poor. Therefore, your fervent prayers and generous help are earnestly requested for building the Kingdom of God, in and through the diocese of Kumbakonam, India.

25TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Are you envious because I am generous?" The landowner in today's Gospel parable surprised everyone. Contrary to standard practice, he paid all of his laborers the same wage, regardless of how many hours they had worked! Of course this was a very pleasant surprise for those who had begun their job late in the day. And, understandably, it was something of a

disappointment for those who had toiled since the morning. From their perspective, they should have gotten more than the others. But in fact the landowner was not cheating anyone; he was simply being especially generous with the latecomers.

This story would have had a special meaning for the Jewish audience listening to Jesus. They, the Chosen People, were the laborers who had started at 9:00 am. They belonged to the group with a long history of worshipping the true God. Non-Jewish Gentiles, on the other hand, had appeared late in the game. Jesus was making the point that just because he would offer the same salvation and mercy to everyone, there should be no reason for the Jews to complain. They had received their promised Messiah; so what if, in God's mercy, he allowed others who had not waited so long to be saved as well? Divine generosity is not meant to be a cause for jealousy.

Now, we may feel removed from the concerns of those Jews. But the basic lesson remains relevant: that we ought to appreciate God's generosity, even when it reaches to those whom we may not expect God to forgive. Those who have long been faithful, for example, might think they deserve more benefits than sinners who repent late in life. But instead, we should all rejoice to see God's mercy extended to EVERYONE, no matter when they joined the fold.





SAINT OF THE WEEK—ST. JEROME

Who is St. Jerome and why is he so significant that we honored him with a feast on September 30?

Biblical scholars and translators owe a great debt to the model and standard that Jerome, 345-420, set for all biblical scholarship. Jerome was considered the greatest biblical scholar of his day, conversant with Latin, Greek, and Hebrew. He set about translatina the books of the Bible from their original languages into Latin.

Much of Jerome's correspondence with his contemporaries has survived and gives us a powerful

glimpse into the kind of person that he was, as well as the time in which he lived. Jerome eventually became Pope Damasus' (366-384) personal secretary. In the West, Latin was overtaking Greek as the language of the common people. The pope desired a translation of the Bible that would be accurately translated from the original languages into the language and idiom of the people. Previous Latin translations existed, but they were poor in quality.

Jerome set about this task and spent the rest of his life meticulously translating. He is credited with the

translation of the Bible know as the Vulgate, a Latin translation intended to address the needs of the common people. That translation became the standard and the only one used by Catholics until modern times. Catholic Christians did not actively engage in a similar process until 1943, when Pius XII allowed Catholic scholars once again to go back to the original languages and translate an accurate and meticulous version of the Bible into the languages of the common people. We carry on that tradition to this very day.

MANANA Maestro Hector Olivera is one of the world's top tier organists and his concert which is being sponsored by Allen Organs and Allen Organs of


Chicago (Bolingbrook). The concert is free and a free will offering will be taken to subsidize future organ concerts at St. Catherine of Siena.
