THE KERYGMA. **PART 3.3** The Passion continued There are many ways to approach the Passion of Jesus. Last week, we looked

at two that we hear

is a third way to understand the Passion that is used most often by the early Church Fathers. Today, we will meditate upon it.

The Church Fathers saw Jesus' Passion as Jesus going to battle for us against powers that we cannot escape from on our own: Sin, Death, Satan, and Hell. God's answer to sin (disobeying and turning away from God) is not only to forgive us but to set us free from

a tyrant.

St. Luke tells us that when Jesus had driven a demon out of a man. the Pharisees accused him of driving out the demon by the prince of demons. Jesus, as usual, answers with a parable that explains what He has come to do. Jesus says, "When a strong man fully armed guards his palace, his possessions are safe. But when one stronger than he attacks him and overcomes him, he takes away the armor on which he relied and distributes the spoils" (Luke 11:21-22). St. Matthew records, "How can anyone enter a strong man's house and steal his property, unless he first ties up the strong man? Then he can plunder his house" (Mt 12:29).

What does this mean? Who is the strong man? The devil. What is the house? This world. What are his agods? Us the human race, which, through sin, have unwittingly sold ourselves into slavery to the devil by our rebellion. Here's where it gets good. Who is the stronger man who binds the devil so he can the goods can go free? Jesus! Pray with these passages this week. God saw us in slavery to sin, death, the devil, and hell, and would not sit by. He sends Jesus His Son to set us free. When have you felt a slave to those powers? Have you felt helpless against them? Pray with that and with the Passion of Jesus - that's why He did it.

Next week, we will look at how He did it.

Reconciliation: Confessions are heard every Wednesday 9:00-10:00am and Saturdays 3:30-4:30pm. Appointments can also be made for confessions to be heard when needed.

Baptism: Children of all ages and adults are welcome to the sacrament of Baptism. Baptism for children is celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month at 1:00pm. Parents need to be registered members and should be faithful in attending Mass. Participation in a baptismal preparation class is required. Please call Sharon Hall at the parish office to make arrangements. Adults seeking Baptism should contact Linda McEwan at Imcewan@stthomasmorechurch.org.

Matrimony: Baptized Catholics are called to be married in the Catholic Church. Arrangements should be made at least six months in advance.

If you were married outside of the Catholic Church and would like to have your marriage blessed, we would be happy to guide you in that process.

Call the parish office to make an appointment with a priest to begin all marriage preparation.

Anointing of the Sick: The anointing of the sick is administered to bring spiritual and physical strength during an illness, for those having surgery, and for those near death. Call the parish office to make arrangements to receive this sacrament.


