

This article is on continuation of last weeks article on food addictions. Once again, feel free to contact me for any help on this topic.

Signs of Food Addiction: Researchers at Yale University's Rudd Center for Food Science & Policy have developed a questionnaire to identify people with food addictions. Here's a sample of questions that can help determine if you have a food addiction. Do these actions apply to you? Do you:

- End up eating more than planned when you start eating certain foods
- Keep eating certain foods even if you're no longer <u>hungry</u>
- Eat to the point of feeling ill
- Worry about not eating certain types of foods or worry about cutting down on certain types of foods
- When certain foods aren't available, go out of your way to obtain them

The questionnaire also asks about the impact of your relationship with food on your personal life. Ask yourself if these situations apply to you:

- You eat certain foods so often or in such large amounts that you start eating food instead of working, spending time with the family, or doing recreational activities.
- You avoid professional or social situations where certain foods are available because of fear of overeating.
- You have problems functioning effectively at your job or school because of food and eating.

The questionnaire asks about psychological withdrawal symptoms. For example, when you cut down on certain foods (excluding caffeinated beverages), do you have symptoms such as: Anxiety— Agitation / Other physical symptoms.

The questionnaire also tries to gauge the impact of food decisions on your emotions. Do these situations apply to you? Eating food causes problems such as <u>depression</u>, <u>anxiety</u>, self-loathing, or guilt.

- You need to eat more and more food to reduce negative emotions or increase pleasure.
- Eating the same amount of food doesn't reduce negative emotions or increase pleasure the way it used to.

Help for Food Addiction: Science is still working to understand and find treatments for food <u>addiction</u>. Some argue that recovery from food addiction may be more complicated than recovery from other kinds of addictions. Alcoholics, for example, can ultimately abstain from drinking alcohol. But people who are addicted to food still need to eat. A nutritionist, <u>psychologist</u>, or doctor who is educated about food addiction may be able to help you break the cycle of compulsive overeating.

RCIA—RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

BECOMING CATHOLIC...WHAT'S HAPPENING IN RCIA? Did you know that this Sunday marks not only the beginning of the season of Advent, but also the beginning of our entire liturgical year? Since the liturgical year is based on the life of Jesus Christ, it is fitting that we should begin our year in preparation for his birth. Like our regular calendar, the liturgical calendar marks seasons, holy days and special celebrations of the lives of those in our Church family. The seasons that are celebrated in the liturgical year are Advent: four weeks of preparation before the celebration of Jesus' birth; Christmas: recalling the Nativity of Jesus Christ and his manifestation to the peoples of the world; Lent: a six-week period of penance before Easter; *The Sacred Triduum*: the holiest "Three Days" of the Church's year, where the Christian people recall the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus; *Easter:* 50 days of joyful celebration of the Lord's resurrection from the dead and his sending forth of the Holy Spirit; and Ordinary Time: divided into two sections--one span of 4-8 weeks after Christmas Time and another lasting about six months after Easter Time--wherein the faithful consider the fullness of Jesus' teaching and works among his people. -- USCCB.com

Our lectionary readings are based on a 3-year cycle, labeled A, B, and C. Our current liturgical year is known as "Year A." Most of the gospel readings for this year will come from the gospel of Matthew. Gospel readings during Easter come from the gospel of John in all three years.


