

The Sacrament of Reconciliation CAN make you smile! By Debbie Chalik

When I joined the Catholic Church, there was only one belief that was difficult for me to embrace: the Sacrament of Reconciliation. I can assure you, it was not because I was sinless (far from it), or because I thought the sacrament was not necessary (it actually made sense). Mostly, it was because I did NOT want to go! Confessing my sins was not easy, and I know there are plenty of Catholics who feel the same.

After a while of trying but failing, I had an opportunity to go to reconciliation with a priest who made me feel comfortable enough to open up. I told him I did not want to be there, that I did have sins, but as a Catholic convert, I was having a difficult time understanding why. He did a great job of explaining the why of reconciliation. For the first time, I felt better for having been!

In the next two weeks, all of our students preparing for First Eucharist (SHS and CFF) will have the chance to celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation. It never ceases to amaze me at the way these wonderful young Catholic children approach this sacrament with joy and anticipation. They usually do not show fear or worry, and they always walk away with a big smile. I think we can learn a lot by watching their wide-eyed innocence. Perhaps they understand what is happening more clearly than many adults!

Please pray for our students as they prepare for First Reconciliation!

Pledges are income projections for the parish. Even if you aren't in a position to increase, turning in a pledge is still very beneficial to Fr. Chris and our Finance Council as they keep us in good fiscal health.

However, if you haven't revisited your pledge from the day you set up your automatic payment, may I respectfully request you do? It's no surprise our costs increase each year. RCIA—RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS


BECOMING CATHOLIC...THE RITE ACCEPTANCE AND WELCOMING. Next weekend at the 4 p.m. Mass, our parish will be celebrating the Rite of Acceptance and Welcoming for our RCIA candidates. This rite marks the passage for our candidates from inquirers to catechumens (for those who are unbaptized) and candidates (for those who have previously been baptized in another Christian tradition). After having studied our faith, they are making a commitment to continue this journey and further their knowledge of and commitment to Christ and his Church. "The Church, in turn, carrying out its apostolic mission, accepts them as persons who intend to become its members. God showers his grace on the candidates, since the celebration manifests their desire publicly and marks their reception and first consecration by the Church." (RCIA, 41)

The next phase, the catechumenate, is an extended period during which the candidates are given pastoral formation and guidance, aimed at training them in the Christian life. As they become familiar with the Christian way of life and are helped by the example and support of sponsors and the entire Christian community, the catechumens and candidates learn to turn more readily to God in prayer, to bear witness to the faith, to keep their hopes set on Christ, to follow supernatural inspiration in their deeds, and to practice love of neighbor, even at the cost of self-renunciation. Thus formed, the newly converted set out on a spiritual journey.

At Mass they may take part with the faithful in the liturgy of the word, thus better preparing themselves for their eventual participation in the liturgy of the Eucharist. Ordinarily, however, when they are present in the assembly of the faithful they should be kindly dismissed before the liturgy of the Eucharist begins. For they must await their baptism, which will join them to God's priestly people and empower them to participate in Christ's new worship. (cf. *RCIA* 75)

Please pray for our RCIA candidates as they continue on this journey of faith.
