## From Deacon Wayne's Desk

THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME ~ JUNE 30, 2019

<u>For you were called for freedom, brothers and sisters.</u> But do not use this freedom as an <u>opportunity for the flesh;</u> Gal 5:13

Freedom is a blessing that God desires for each of us to live in. Because God is Love, the meaning of the statement if you love someone set them free takes on a whole new light. St

Paul reminds us we are called by God to be free, free from sin, free to love others with respect, free to give of yourself. Where we find freedom we find love. Anything contrary to freedom can never be love. In other words, we can never be forced to love. God has given us a free will so as we ever turn back to him and love him as he does us it will be because you came freely back to Him rather than being forced. Freedom and Love do not force us to do anything. They only open a door for us to give fully of ourselves without reserving anything for ourselves. C.S. Lewis put it best in his book – The Four Loves:

God, who needs nothing, loves into existence wholly superfluous creatures in order that he may love and perfect them. He creates the universe, already foreseeing - or should we say "seeing"? there are no tenses in God - the buzzing cloud of flies about the cross, the flayed back pressed against the uneven stake, the nails driven through the mesial nerves, the repeated incipient suffocation as the body droops, the repeated torture of back and arms as it is time after time, for breath's sake, hitched up. If I may dare the biological image, God is a "host" who deliberately creates his own parasites; causes us to be that we may exploit and "take advantage of" him. Herein is love. This is the diagram of Love himself, the inventor of all loves.

We in this country cherish the fact we are free. Free to vote, free to come and go, freedoms of practicing religion but in our world the term freedom (just like the word love) has been twisted to suggest something completely different from what God's plan for freedom really means. Fr Joe Krupp wrote this in a recent Faith Magazine article about what love is

As I get older, I realize that the less my needs are present in the equation, and when my love looks more like giving than taking, the more perfect that love is.

When we love, we are experiencing the most perfect freedom humanly possible. To love without cost. Love never counts the wrongs done, and always looks forward that is why Jesus said, "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God."

As we celebrate our freedom as American citizens this Fourth of July let our freedom be a reminder that we are only seeing a glimpse of the freedom God calls us to in loving Him and our neighbor. Remember, freedom isn't free. It's the freedom to choose to do the right thing.

This weekend- we welcome our new Sacramental Minister, Fr Bill Wegher. Fr Bill will be our main celebrant for Masses, along with any of our sacramental needs.
