# Jesus Christ is Risen alleluia alleluia!

THE SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER - MAY 22, 2022



Due to Ascension Thursday moving to next Sunday, May 29, we have the option of using either the readings for the 6<sup>th</sup> or 7<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter this weekend. So, we chose the Seventh Sunday of Easter readings for today.

In our first reading, we hear the wonderful faith filled story of the first martyr of the Church, Saint Stephen who also just happens to be a deacon and the patron saint of deacons. In this story, we have St Stephen exhorting the rulers of that day by opening the scriptures as Jesus did for the disciples on the Road to Emmaus, except with a different ending. When St. Stephen finishes his romp through salvation history, he then calls them names, like "stiffed neck people" and "murderers." With this, his audience turns on him to stone him to death.

In the heat of all this, Stephen, filled with the Holy Spirit, looks up intently to heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at His right hand. And says to the crowd, "Behold, I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God." The crowd angered refuses to listen and they stone him. But, Stephen has the last words, he called out, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." Then he fell to his knees and cried out in a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them."

Last Monday, May 16, marked the 13<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the ordination of Deacon Greg and I to the Diaconate. On behalf of Deacon Greg we want to say what a privilege and honor it is to serve you, our whole parish family and our community. We are happy that we haven't angered anyone to the point of stoning us, yet.

Then three years ago, Bishop Boyea asked me if I would accept the responsibility of being our parish administrator. Now, this brought with it many joyful times as well as hardships. This experience has been a true blessing that I wouldn't trade for anything.

The times we find ourselves in requires changes in our church. One of them is that we face the shortage of priests. We are blessed to have Fr. Bill as our sacramental minister and I, like all of you, love and appreciate him. We face times where the structure of the church is changing because of things like the priest shortage. So, here we are at SMSJ with a wonderful priest and two deacons and one who was selected to run the parish as administrator.

This may not be how you would have ever imagined our church being structured, but as I start my fourth year as your administrator, I turn to each of you with great joy knowing that if this is to be the new model of what a parish structure is to look like, then everyone of you have shared in the ongoing successes of our parish family of SMSJ.

We should be convinced as we look back over what we have been through in the last three years (including covid) and realize that through hard work and dedication we will survive/thrive. Together as a parish family, our responsibility is to carry the Good News into our communities, workplaces, and homes. In doing this, we shouldn't be surprised that we will meet resistance, and it may even feel like you are about to be "stoned." Don't focus on that though, focus on being filled with the Holy Spirit just as Stephen when he looked up intently to heaven. We too will see the glory of God and Jesus standing at His right hand.

It is with great joy in my heart that I have a perfect view of watching all of you working together, sharing your faith, and caring for each other here at SMSJ and our community. And in that, I too see the Glory of God and Jesus. Thanks for putting up with me and please keep those stones on the ground!

Christ is Risen! Mary, Seat of Wisdom guide us! St Joseph pray for us!
