St. Joseph ITBS Scores for 2017 - 2018

On Sunday, the Bradenton Times reported that only 49% of the third graders in Manatee public and charter schools received a score of 3 or higher on the Florida Standards Assessment English Language Arts exam. This means that only 49% of the students were at, or above, grade level.

Several parents have asked how St. Joseph Catholic School students perform on their annual testing. Please see the attachéd report, which was shared with our school board. We can be very proud of our teachers and students.

[Broadcom MASTERS (Math, Applied Science, Technology and Engineering for Rising Stars), is the premier science and engineering competition for middle school students.]



Congratulations to Nicolas Curci, who was recognized as a nominee for the **Broadcom MASTERS** national middle school science competition! Congratulations to St. Joseph Catholic School on this achievement!

Nicolas's selection as a Broadcom MASTERS nominee is a great honor—only the top 10% of science fair projects nationwide are selected for this opportunity. Nicolas will receive a t-shirt and bumper sticker, and could be named one of the Top 300 MASTERS (announced September 5th) or one of the 30 finalists (announced September 19th). The 30 finalists will gather in

Washington, DC for a week of competition—including presentation of the research project and hands-on science and engineering challenges. Top prizes include \$25,000, trips to STEM summer camps, and more. Schools of Broadcom MASTERS finalists each receive \$1,000 from the Broadcom Foundation.

SUMMER LEARNING CHALLENGE



St. Joseph Catholic School students will have access to IXL all summer. Please check with your child regarding login information. IXL has been used for math at SJCS in classrooms and the computer lab. The program was recently expanded to include reading, science, social studies, and Spanish (Grades 2 - 8). Students may work at their own pace to improve their academic skills.

Why work during the summer? On average, students lose about two months of reading/math skills during the summer according to Oxford Learning and Harvard Education. In order to ensure students do not lose imperative skills during the summer, which creates an achievement gap, we would like all students to work on the IXL program, on skills that were learned throughout the school year.

Each week the top five students will be tracked for each grade level. When school resumes in August, students who completed at least one "virtual medal" in math and one in language arts will enjoy an ice cream party. In addition, the top three students (most time logged for practice) will receive award medals (real – not virtual) when students return to campus.

ITBS National Testing Scores 2017 - 2018

Florida public schools administer the FSA, which is a standardized norm-referenced test. Norm-referenced testing was developed in order to glean information in a quick and efficient manner. Norm-referenced testing compares the performance of the student taking the test, against the performance of the norm group. The norm-referenced group for the FSA is a representative sample of students across Florida who were tested the same year.

The Catholic Schools in the United States use the ITBS (Iowa Test of Basic Skills), a nationally norm-referenced test, which assesses student achievement in reading, vocabulary, grammar, spelling, writing, punctuation, research skills, math computation, problem solving, data interpretation, science, and social studies. The ITBS is norm referenced with students across the United States.

Students are tested in the spring to determine areas of strength, as well as areas for continued growth during the school year. Teachers can use this data as they review curriculum and plan for greater student achievement.

Overall, St. Joseph Catholic School students performed very well on these national tests. In the chart below, the first data column indicates the percentage of students scoring at, or above, grade level. The second data column indicates the percentage of students who scored in the top quarter of the nation. The data in the third column indicates students who achieved scores in the top 5% of the nation.

We are very proud of our teachers and students who work hard each day to continue the St. Joseph Catholic School legacy of maintaining high academic excellence.

Due to the differences in the FSA and the ITBS, it is difficult to compare testing results. However, it is possible to compare percentages as related to At or Above Grade Level performance. For the 2016-2017 school year, Manatee County Public and Charter schools reported an At or Above Grade Level average in language arts as 50%, and the At or Above Grade level average of 56% for mathematics.
