Pflaum Gospel Weeklies: An Introduction for Families

The faith formation program we are using is called the *Pflaum Gospel Weeklies*. This program differs from other programs in a number of significant ways that make it an effective way to teach your children.

1 Liturgical Catechesis

This is a method of instruction that integrates faith formation lessons with the life of the parish community experienced in the Sunday Eucharist. The content of the program flows from the Sunday Gospel and children learn their faith within the rhythms of the liturgical year – Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter and Ordinary Time.

2 Sunday Mass

The Sunday liturgy is the heart of the parish community. The weekly celebration is more meaningful to young people because they are familiar with the Gospel proclaimed each week. They have studied it in class and wrestled with its meaning. With this program all students and their families hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ. They learn the Gospel. They love the Gospel. They live the Gospel in their daily lives. They share the Gospel both in the community of faith and, by their witness and loving service of others, with every person they meet.

3 Family Involvement

Your whole family can easily share in the learning because all children are studying lessons based on the same Gospel proclaimed in church on Sunday. You can gather all your children at one time to share what they have learned and to talk about it as a family.

4 Unique Materials

Because *Pflaum Gospel Weeklies* do not use a textbook, they are very appealing to young people and easy to use in class and at home. Each child receives a “catechism handbook” called *What the Church Believes and Teaches* (or *Mi fe católica*, the bilingual version). This handbook contains all the doctrinal elements that are considered essential at each grade level. Each week your child will receive a new lesson dated for each Sunday of the liturgical year. These lessons are at the heart of the program and will be used in class and then brought home for you to see and talk about with your children.

5 Five Editions

The *Weeklies* follow the three cycles of Gospel readings in five editions used to cover all the grade levels: *Seeds* (Preschool), *Promise* (Kindergarten and Grade 1), *Good News for Children* (Grades 2 and 3), *Venture* (Grades 4-6), and *Visions* (Grades 7 and 8).

6 Online Resources

The free resources designed for families include *The Gospel At Home*, which is a weekly summary of the Sunday Gospel and suggestions for you to use at home. You can sign up to get an email reminder with a link to the resource. There are additional seasonal resources as well. All of these can be found at pflaumweeklies.com.

The Gospel at Home

This Sunday's Gospel: Mark 9:30–37

This Sunday, Jesus teaches that his highest value is service. He puts his arms around a child to show that welcoming others, even children, is welcoming him. Jesus wants his followers to be warm and welcoming to everyone, no matter who it is, as if that person were Jesus himself.

Exploring the Gospel Message

Seeds (Preschool): Take time to go through Seeds with your child. Ask your child to use the picture on the cover to tell you about the Gospel story. Have your child show you the different paths to church and talk about going to Mass as a family on Sunday.

Promise (Grades K–1): Talk with your child about where he or she learns about Jesus. Your child will be able to tell you who are Jesus' followers and how we all come together during Mass to celebrate the Eucharist. Look at the self-portrait your child drew on page 4.

Good News (Grades 2–3): Have your child tell you the story of Anne and her new baby brothers. Ask how Anne helped her family and how your child helps at home. Your child also learned that Jesus wants all his followers to welcome and serve others. That is how everyone can be Good News for others. Talk about ways your family can welcome and serve others.

Venture (Grades 4–6): Your child explored what makes a good friend and how one shows friendship by respecting and serving others. Ask your child to share with the family what he or she learned about “being” the Church. Talk about ways that you and your family can be welcoming to others. Agree on one specific thing to do and then act on it.

Visions (Grades 7–8): In class this week, your youngster discussed again just how much Jesus values service as an identifying mark of his disciples. The class also learned to recognize the Church as the assembly—the Body of Christ. Take some time as a family to review your experience of Sunday Mass. Use the questions on page 5 of the lesson to guide your conversation. Make a list of ways that your family can more actively participate in the Sunday assembly.

Pray Together

When you complete your conversation about this Sunday's Gospel lesson, pray together in your own words that God will help your family grow in faith throughout this year.

NOTE FROM SJCS:

Each week our students will participate in Religion classes that will follow the liturgical year and will be based on the Sunday readings. This week students will be preparing for next Sunday. These family connections are provided for sharing faith at home and building on the lessons learned in school.
