A Note From Fr. Bill

The Gospel of John has a unique vocabulary and one of John's key phrases is remain in me or abide in me. This same Greek word also expresses the bond between the Father and Son, as well as the bond between the Son and the Holy Spirit. In addition, it describes the relationship which God institutes with those who keep the faith and abide by the commandments. This Greek verb, then, graphically expresses the bond between Jesus and His disciples. The passage begins with Jesus making this solemn revelation, "I am the true vine.." These I am statements are seven in number, beginning with Jesus declaring that He is the bread of life (Jn 6:35) up to the last I am statement—I am the true vine prominent in this week's gospel. In the Old Testament, the Israelites are frequently referred to as the vine that the Lord God had planted: "You brought a vine out of Egypt; you drove out nations and planted it" (Ps 80:9). Thus, as the Lord's choicest possession, Israel was the object of His love and care and so, because of her divine favor, the people should manifest the fruit of justice and holiness. Too often, though, prosperity led to infidelity and idolatry and the Lord had to safeguard the healthy vines and prune away the decadent ones. Repeatedly, Jesus states that only by remaining in Him will fruitfulness be assured, though even healthy vines need trimming. Constant, unwavering fidelity to Christ—in season and out—is the only way to remain faithful. As any vineyard owner is proud to see his or her well-pruned vines laden with grapes, a fruitful life of faith gives glory to God the Father. Putting into concrete actions what we profess to believe is required and, thereby abiding in Christ, those words and deeds constitute our faithful witness to our belief that Jesus is the true vine.
