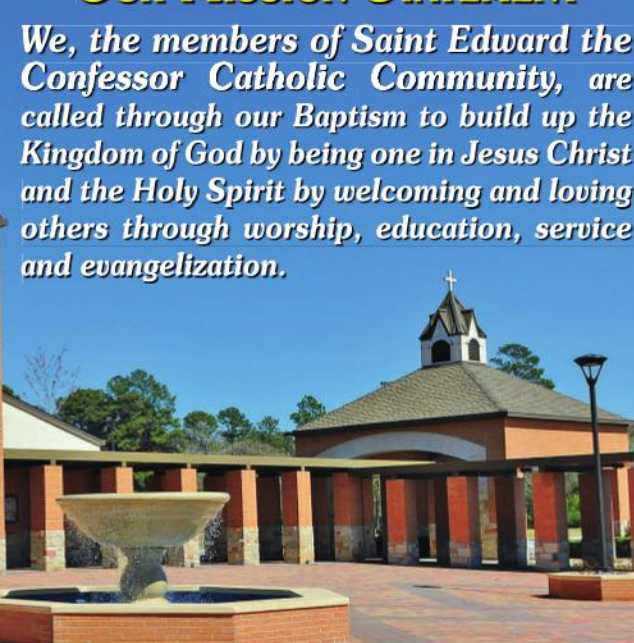

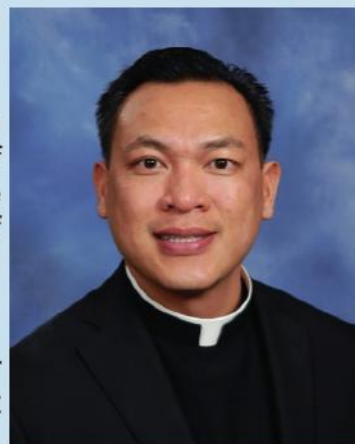
Throughout this week, we can wake up and go through our morning routine asking for the grace that God's mercy might flow through us this day.

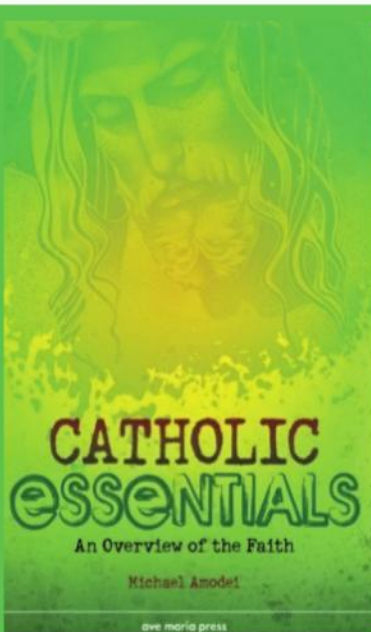
Throughout this week, we'll be embracing little children and other "little ones" because we will be delighting in being one with Him and His being one with us. And, we'll give thanks and praise.

LITURGY CORNER

For this first edition of the Liturgy corner I thought it would be appropriate to define the word itself. So here goes:

It is a particular form of public service performed by a church. This form of the word is medieval Latin. That is taken from a Greek word Leitourgia and that is from a compound word Leitourgos that breaks down like this: Leit = people + ergon = work or as we would say "work of the people".

Roman Catholics refer to all of the rites as Liturgy. Eastern Catholics call it "Divine Liturgy" referring only to the Eucharist. We as Roman Catholics refer to the whole Mass as liturgy but, we also break it down, such as Liturgy of the Word, or Liturgy of the Eucharist.

So liturgy has been a public work done for a community or by a community since ancient times. Our work is done for worship to our God as a free offering in response to our Lord's graciousness to us.

MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT GIFT BEARER



If the three wise men had said "no" in their desire to follow the star, our Lord would not have received the gifts they brought. Two thousand years later, within our parishes, the gifts are still being presented to Him, and what an honor it is to present the gifts at Mass. Gift Bearers actively participate in the Celebration of the Mass by presenting the gifts of Bread and Wine at the altar and require no special skill or permanent ministerial duty, and yet it is a beautiful and significant part of the Mass performed by lay people. It is a ministry where the entire family can be involved. At least 2 people are needed at each Mass to bring the gifts up to the priest at the altar. Please check the sign-up sheet in the Usher's Room before each Mass and touch base with an usher when you arrive if you would like to participate. There are 52 Sundays in a year and 4 Masses each weekend. That is 208 Masses that need your participation, not to mention the Holy Days of Obligation. 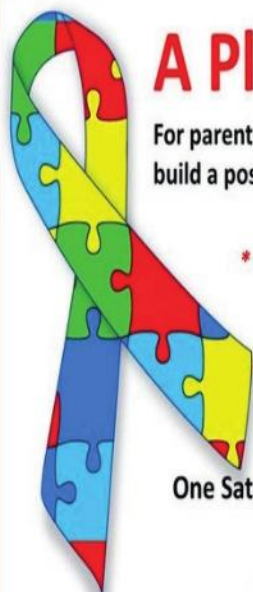
ST. IGNATIUS—PART TIME POSITION

PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN

Preventing child sexual abuse is the goal of the Archdiocesan Safe Environment Office. "Protecting God's Children" is the program selected by the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston to educate clergy, staff, and volunteers who work with children and youth about child sexual abuse and the ways to create a safe environment for children. The 3-hour live session includes videos and facilitated discussions that focus on the prevention of abuse and the protection of children. Adults learn how to recognize the warning signs of sexual abuse and to respond appropriately. You will learn about steps that the faith community can take to create a safe environment for all God's children and how to respond when adults behave in a way that raises concerns.

A "Protecting God's Children" workshop will be held at St. Edward Parish on August 13, 2016 from 9:00am-12:00 noon in the Parish Life Center.

You must arrive at least 30 minutes early and pre-register for this workshop online. We do not allow late admittance or walk-ins. You will need to re-schedule if you arrive late or do not pre-register online for this workshop.

There is no babysitting. No minor child, toddler or infant is permitted in the workshop. There is no exception to this. Do not bring children or youth to the class.

All attendees must have a current Driver's license (any state), State-issued Identification Card, Passport (any country), Mexico or Guatemala Consulate ID in order to attend a "Protecting God's Children" Workshop. When pre-registering for the class, **YOU MUST USE YOUR NAME and DATE OF BIRTH** as it appears on your DL, ID, or Passport. Please pre-register online at www.virtusonline.org.

KEEPING THE PROMISE ALIVE

"Keeping the Promise Alive" is a mandatory refresher course that went into effect 2011-2012. Employees and volunteers are required to attend "Keeping the Promise Alive" after 5 years of attending the "Protecting God's Children"® program. It is a 1.5 hour session with one video that provides ongoing awareness for the prevention of child sexual abuse. The material covered in "Keeping the Promise Alive" is designed to identify and reinforce the lessons of the original "Protecting God's Children" program by clarifying some of the more challenging aspects of the sessions and strengthening the participants' ability to recognize risky behavior by adults in their environments and take action to intervene in potentially threatening situations.

A "Keeping the Promise Alive" workshop will be held at St. Edward Parish on August 10, 2016 from 7pm-8:30pm in the Parish Life Center.

You must arrive at least 30 minutes early and pre-register for this workshop online. We do not allow late admittance or walk-ins. You will need to re-schedule if you arrive late or do not pre-register online for this workshop.

There is no babysitting. No minor child, toddler or infant is permitted in the workshop. There is no exception to this. Do not bring children or youth to the class.
