Homily at a Funeral Liturgy

I remember watching the previously recorded funeral Mass of the late Supreme Court Justice Antonin Scalia. His son, Fr. Paul Scalia, gave the homily for his father's funeral. What a blessing to have a son that becomes a priest and preaches at their father's funeral. Anyway, I believe this was a perfect example of a homily that should be given at a funeral Mass. If you have not heard this homily, I highly recommend viewing it on YouTube.

The homily was not a eulogy to his famous father; it was not a speech that solely praises Antonin Scalia. Rather, Fr. Scalia praises the Lord for granting life to his father. The homily was precisely what the Church envisions at a funeral liturgy.

As Fr. Scalia gave thanks to Jesus Christ, he sprinkled a bit about his father and his father's relationship with the Lord: "He tried to love God and neighbor, but like the rest of us, did so imperfectly. He was a practicing Catholic – practicing in the sense that he hadn't perfected it vet."

Often there is a tendency to praise the deceased to console family and friends. The homilist must be cautious that praise does not deprive the deceased of prayers to God that they be freed from the burden of sin to gain eternal reward. Fr. Scalia explains: "Even when the deceased was an admirable person, praise for his virtues can cause us to forget that we are praying for and giving thanks for God's inexplicable mercy to a sinner...We are here then, as he would want to pray for God's inexplicable mercy to a sinner; to this sinner, Antonin Scalia. Let us not show him a false love and allow our admiration to deprive him of our prayers."

Finally, Fr. Scalia says: "We cannot depart here unchanged." The funeral homily should also challenge us to think about our own mortality. By acknowledging we too will die someday, it gives us an urgency to repent and be like Christ. Let us pray for God to have mercy on our deceased members of our family and community. Let us offer Mass intentions for the repose of their souls... you can call the office for more information about Mass intentions. And let us beg God for the strength to face our own mortality with great hope for the resurrection of the dead and eternal life to come.


