Erin Makel 281-353-4570 Pentecost is a significant event in the Christian calendar, celebrated 50 days after Easter Sunday. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ, as described in the Book of Acts. As recorded in Acts 2, the Spirit empowered ordinary people to speak in many languages, boldly proclaiming the Gospel to all nations. That same Spirit moves among us today igniting our faith, stirring our hearts, and sending us forth as Christ's witnesses.

This event is often referred to as the "birthday of the Church" because it marks the beginning of the apostles' public ministry and the spread of Christianity.

#### What happened on Pentecost:

The disciples were gathered in Jerusalem during the Jewish Feast of Weeks and a sound like a rushing wind filled the house. Then, tongues of fire appeared and rested on each of them. They were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different languages. This enabled them to proclaim the message of Jesus to people from many nations who were in Jerusalem at the time.

#### **Spiritual Meaning of Pentecost**

- 1. Empowerment by the Holy Spirit Pentecost signifies the moment when God's Spirit empowered ordinary people to do extraordinary things—preach, heal, and live out the gospel boldly.
- 2. Unity in Diversity The speaking of many languages symbolizes the unity of people from all nations through the Spirit, countering the division at the Tower of Babel.
- 3. The Birth of the Church It marks the beginning of the Christian community's mission in the world, emphasizing evangelism, service, and community.

May we be open to the Holy Spirit's presence in our lives—guiding, comforting, and equipping us to share God's love with a world in need. "Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love."

## LOAVES AND FISHES SUNDAY

On the first weekend of each month, you might have noticed large wicker baskets in the Narthex. This is followed by the usual announcement at Mass, "The second collection today will benefit... Loaves and Fishes."

#### What is Loaves and Fishes?

Loaves and Fishes is a special collection on the first weekend of each month that benefits those in need, especially the poor, the hungry, and homeless. A portion of this collection also supports St. Mary's Seminary and St. Dominic Village.

### What is the significance of "Loaves and Fishes?"

We read in Luke 9:10-17 that Jesus fed the crowds with only five loaves and two fish. After his Apostles had gathered all that they had, Jesus blessed and broke the loaves and fish, and gave it to the crowd – about five-thousand in total. All ate and were satisfied, and there was enough leftover to fill twelve baskets. Likewise, we are called to share what we can with others who are in need.

### How can I give to Loaves and Fishes?

- 1. Monetarily: On the first weekend of the month, there are collection baskets which are placed at the steps of the sanctuary. The priest or deacon usually invites those who would like to give to place their contribution in the basket.
- 2.Food/non-perishable goods: On the first weekend of the month, there are large wicker baskets placed in the Narthex. You may drop off any food and non-perishable items in these baskets. This food is taken directly to catholic organizations around Houston who feed the poor.

#### Who benefits from Loaves and Fishes?

There are five organizations which Loaves and Fishes support: Catholic Charities, Casa de Esperanza, Northwest Assistance Ministries, St. Mary's Seminary, St. Dominic Village and St. Vincent de Paul. *Please help us support those in need!*


